With homes popping up there, our focus shifts to completing facilities. The slab for the Country Club is down and

frames are going up, while progress continues to be made on the revetment wall along the Boomerang Cove marina precinct. We are also in the final planning stages for some beautiful three-storey apartment blocks overlooking this marina – Palm Lake Group founder/director Walter even has his eye on a penthouse there!

With 2022 approaching, all eyes are on our Pelican Waters project. A distinctive and premier address in the Palm Lake Group stable, this site has taken some \$55 million worth of civils works just to get it off the ground, but we know it'll be one knock-out address for the lucky residents of the 321 opulent homes (some waterfront and/or golf course access) earmarked for this resort. With our Greg Norman-designed golf course and Pelican Waters Hotel as neighbours, Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters homeowners will be blessed with everything they need, for the ultimate in lifestyle, right on their doorsteps.



The summer of 2021-22 heralds an exciting chapter in Palm Lake Group's history book with Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters sales finally getting underway.

IF YOU'VE LONGED for a Californian/Palm Springs holiday in the sunshine, you can live that dream every day at Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters. Palm Lake Group's première over-50s community lifestyle resort, Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters is currently under construction right alongside our Greg Norman-designed Pelican Waters Golf Course. In fact, the Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters project is really hotting up, with final artist impressions of our opulent community facilities as well as home designs and floorplans to be unveiled early in the New Year. The Palm Springs energy is clear. Textured stone cladding will contrast with clean white lines and the odd pop of strategically placed colour. Mature palm trees meet desert cacti. Patterned breezeblocks add another level of depth and texture to the palette. These community facilities will be places where busy social calendars collide with ultimate relaxation - where residents and their guests are equally at home enjoying a quiet cocktail on the pool deck in the sun, or a big group celebratory dinner peppered with belly laughs and fun.

With 28 resort addresses across three states of Australia, six aged caring communities and 44 years' experience in developing lifestyle communities, there is no comparison to Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters – it is unquestionably Palm Lake Group's most opulent and luxurious resort project ever. Palm Lake Group Managing Director Scott Elliott labelled the development a "game changer".

"We up the ante with every new resort we develop and Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters will be something that Australia's over-50s population has never before seen," Scott says.

Before the project even commences, Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters is leaps and bounds ahead of the competition with thanks to its remarkable location. The resort masterplan was designed to take advantage of both the Sunshine Coast's impressive natural environment and wildlife-filled waterways, as well as the Greg Norman-designed golf course that hugs the resort's eastern boundary.

Among the 321 custom-designed homes proposed for this community (in two distinct residential enclaves), 60 will be waterfront, 44 will be golf front and eight of the waterfront homes will also back onto the golf course. All will enjoy those world-class facilities that the Palm Lake Resort brand is renowned for. This includes an impressive lakefront community 'hub', offering social, sporting and wellness facilities.

From a social perspective, **The Springs Country Club** will feature a main lounge and dining area, luxury movie cinema and an outdoor pool, cantilevered over the adjacent waterway (complete with pool bar, no less).

For those more active residents, the **Eldorado Sports Club** will be central between a championship eight-rink undercover lawn bowls green on one side, with tennis and pickleball courts on the other. The clubhouse itself will house a golf simulator room, bar and lounge options.

To round out the facilities, the **Mirador Wellness Centre** will support residents' wellness via an exclusive Milon gymnasium, yoga and Pilates studio, salt therapy room, sauna, indoor heated pool, library, craft room and more.

Of course, the Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters home designs will have homeowners feeling like they are living a holiday every day. One- and two-storey, three-bedroom homes (the two-storey designs even come with a lift) mix opulent details with functionality. The low maintenance nature of these abodes allow their owners the scope to travel at a moment's notice – or simply spend their days enjoying the golf course. Every home will come with the option of a free premium golf car as well as an extended garage to house their golfing wheels, as part of the purchase. Golf buggy parking and cart paths/access will be available all throughout the resort grounds.

Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters is one element of a greater total luxury precinct emerging here at Pelican Waters. As well as the over-50s resort and Greg-Norman designed Pelican Waters Golf Course, there's a dramatic upgrade of the golf clubhouse underway right now that will see a hotel-style facility available to the wider local community – Pelican Waters Hotel. There will also be a new stand-alone pro shop, training academy, mini golf, pitch and putt, driving range and glass-clad lakeside chapel to complete the precinct. It will be a destination for the whole Sunshine Coast community, not just limited to those avid golf lovers and/or Palm Lake Resort residents.

Palm Lake Group's GM of Development, Suzanne Jensen, says the redeveloped golf course will be ready for play in early 2022 with Pelican Waters Hotel expected to be complete in mid-2022. It is expected that Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters will welcome its first residents early in 2023.

Ahead of the exciting release of Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters artist impressions and floor plans early next year, the resort's new logo has been unveiled (pictured top right), along with a moodboard of resort architecture, materials and textures, landscaping and more. #### DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

THE LIST OF Palm Lake Group construction projects is an ever-evolving one that definitely keeps us all on our toes. Firstly, with only a handful of homes to sell, we are seeing construction wrap up at Beachmere Bay, Caloundra Cay and Toowoomba. Our development teams should be out of those locations in the first half of 2022. At Bargara, we've been proud to unveil the new Horizons Country Club for our 131-home resort extension. Civils are about to wrap up and it's full steam ahead into building homes there. In fact, our first homeowners (in the extension) will be unpacking their belongings in early December.

Down at Forster Lakes, our Precinct 1 civils (Stages 1-5) are now complete. The Country Club there is due for completion in mid-2022 with the eight-rink bowls green construction to then get underway. Boomerang Cove bulk earthworks and the marina revetment and retaining walls are all underway, with a view to having that work wrapped up by Easter 2022. We also have approvals in place, and plans underway, for three-storey waterfront apartment buildings at this resort's marina, which is very exciting. More details of that project will come in 2022.

At Willow Lodge, our extension and renovation of the clubhouse had stalled due to COVID and the lack of availability of tradespeople and materials, but Glen Aylett and Matt Dawes are doing great work to bring that project back on. In fact, our entire development and construction team, across the east coast of Australia, has fared extremely well under challenging circumstances throughout 2021. We are so grateful to have such an amazing team at Palm Lake Works.

Finally, over at Pelican Waters, earthworks and revetment walls should be complete by Easter 2022 with internal resort road works to commence mid 2022. Home designs are near complete, ready for their launch in early 2022. The golf clubhouse renovation project is also due for completion June with construction of the golf driving range facility to start around the same time. The golf course renovation is looking amazing with returfing now underway, before our greens-keeping team start on their final finessing of the surface, ready for play mid next year. This is an extremely exciting project, expecting to take Palm Lake Resort to a whole new level of elite resort living. To read more about what's on the drawing board for our planning team, see Page 22. There's no doubt 2022 is going to offer another exciting year of development for Palm Lake Group.

# FIELD OF HIS OWN

Pelican Waters Golf Club's Grant Field has been named Coach of the Year (High Performance) at the recent Queensland Golf Industry Awards.

**GUIDING CAMERON SMITH** and Louis Dobbelaar to become Australia's highest-ranked male professional and amateur golfers respectively saw Pelican Waters Golf Club's Grant Field take out the coveted 'Coach of the Year' award in front of more than 350 guests at a glittering awards night at The Star on the Gold Coast. Grant says he's "extremely honoured" by the gong, showering his players, team and family with gratitude.

"A big thank you to all the players I get to spend time with on a daily basis who help me continue to improve as a coach," Grant says. "You guys constantly drive me to be better, and for that I am hugely grateful."

He also thanked Pelican Waters Golf Club for their support.

"I love being a part of such a wonderful club and I look forward to what the future holds," he says. "I am very fortunate to be part of such wonderful organisations that do their absolute best to provide opportunity for young aspiring golfers." Since the start of 2020, Grant's protégé, Cameron, has climbed from outside the top 50 in the Official World Golf Rankings to now be at a career-high of 21st and on the verge of breaking into the Top 20 in the world. His breakthrough individual PGA Tour title at the Sony Open was the start of an impressive run for Smith who was runner-up at the 2020 Masters, won the Zurich Classic alongside Marc Leishman and represented Australia at the Tokyo Olympics.

In the time of COVID where travel has been difficult, Cameron says it is Grant's communication and strong foundation that has enabled them to continue to find success despite being unable to work together in person.

"It's pretty weird not being able to see him face to face but we've done a pretty good job of staying on top of things with video and FaceTime," says Cameron. "Before I came out on tour we had a pretty good idea of what worked and what didn't and we just kept getting better 1 per cent at a time."



It's dominated interior design for years now – and been embraced at many a Palm Lake Resort location – but what exactly is it that makes 'coastal style' so cool? Ashley Reed, interior designer from Studio Collective, explains.

**LIGHT, BRIGHT AND** natural are three words that sum up coastal interior design perfectly. With a focus on indoor/ outdoor living, the design style is all about embracing the temperate climates of the seaside locations it evokes. But you don't need to live in Malibu, Mexico or even Noosa to achieve the coastal look.

"Natural textures and light colours are key for anyone trying to master this style," says Studio Collective's Ashley Reed (a design consultant on many of our most recent Palm Lake Group projects). "Opt for textiles made from jute or linen and choose furniture that has a white wash or weathered timber finish."

For colours, it's (perhaps unsurprisingly) all about white and beige, but don't shy away from the odd cool blue hue here and there. Ashley also suggests sourcing some fresh greenery – whether it's in the form of large plant pots or flowers in vases – to achieve that 'outside inside' feel. "Greenery is an affordable way to easily create a sense of freshness, as are your soft furnishings," says Ashley. "Introducing cushions in lighter, brighter colours is a great, easy trick."

For key furniture pieces, Ashley says it's definitely worth investing here. She suggests a comfortable statement sofa or dining table to really bring together your cosy, coastal oasis. You could also get crafty and give that old chest of drawers a wash with white paint, to give it a new lease on life! "Wherever possible, opt for blonde timbers and lots of

panelling to bring in more natural texture," explains Ashley. "This could be on the floors and walls if you are doing a larger renovation, or in the form of a coffee table and bedside tables, bookshelves and chairs if you're making smaller changes."

Décor is the cherry on top for any interior design style because the devil really is in the details. Ashley recommends layering your décor through books, trinkets and sculptures, while incorporating natural elements you have collected. "Don't be afraid to showcase your shell collection or hang pieces of driftwood you find on the beach," says Ashley. "This will give your space an immediate coastal look while also feeling homely and personal."

Looking for inspiration? Ashley's professional recommendation is to hit the beach - and we certainly won't argue with that!

"You will find endless inspiration in your favourite seaside town, so comb through their boutique cafes and homewares stores as well as the beach itself," says Ashley. "And, as always, magazines and Pinterest are both great places to source inspiration."

# VISUAL FEAST

We've spent so much time separated from our friends and family over the past two years, be it by distance, border closures or both. This festive season, it's never been more important to eat, drink and be merry with your loved ones — and for goodness sake, use the good china.

THERE IS A LOT to celebrate this summer. There's the usual Christmas and New Year's festivities, of course, but also the fact that for the first time in almost two years we can finally feel the return of some normalcy. What better reason to throw open your front door and welcome in your loved ones for a feast? Your Palm Lake Resort home provides the perfect setting for your next family lunch, gathering of neighbours, or a more intimate dinner party – you just need to know a few simple tips to prepare your table setting.

#### Invest in the staples

No one has the space to store several dinner sets, but that doesn't mean you need to settle for an identical table setting every time you host. A great way to achieve this is to add some personal touches – dig out those retro wine glasses you were given at your 21st birthday, or mix the cutlery set you inherited from your grandmother with the one you and your partner bought for your first home. Look around your home and see if there are any personal mementos you would like to include on your table (a family heirloom or beloved vase, perhaps). You've laid the groundwork with your coordinated table linen and serveware, so you don't have to worry about ensuring everything else matches perfectly. If it's a fancy dinner you're hosting, why not do up some place cards? Make it fun by writing trivia questions on the back, or a fun fact about the person sitting next to them to encourage conversation.



# THE PERFECT CHEESE PLATTER

Ahhh, summer – it's the season of entertaining here in Australia, when neighbours, friends and family come together to celebrate, well, just about anything.

**EVEN WHEN YOU'RE** told not to bring a thing to a gathering of people, it's nice to not turn up empty handed, right? One of the most tried and true 'bring a plate' options is the cheese board. Cheese platters really are crowd favourites and should be your Number 1 go-to because whatever the crowd's taste, there's always something on a good cheese platter that everyone can enjoy.

Here are our tips on curating the perfect selection to have your hostess thinking you are the one with the 'mostest'.

- A soft cheese like brie, goat's cheese or camembert
- A hard cheese like cheddar or gouda
- A blue cheese like gorgonzola, Roquefort or stilton
- A mix of crackers and bread
- A selection of dips, both dairy-based (ie, French onion) and dairy free (ie, pesto)
- Quince paste
- Something salty, like olives, cured meats or nuts
- Something sweet, like fruit or chocolate.

Also, note that presentation is key when it comes to a memorable platter. Rustic wooden chopping boards make a great base for your platter - and don't forget the cheese knife.



Chilli chicken BLT

Serves 4

#### Ingredients:

- · 2 skinless boneless chicken breasts
- 2 large red chillies, seeded and chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 handful flat-leaf (Italian) parsley leaves, roughly chopped
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 4 rashers streaky bacon
- · 4 soft bread rolls
- · Mayonnaise, to serve
- 2 large handfuls baby rocket (arugula)
- 2 tomatoes, thinly sliced

**Method:** Lay the chicken on a clean chopping board. Gently press the palm of your hand on the chicken and use a sharp

knife to slice it horizontally into 2 thinner pieces. Put into a bowl. Combine the chillies, garlic and parsley in a small food processor. Add the olive oil and whiz until the mixture is finely chopped and flecked through the oil. Tip into the bowl with the chicken and toss together with your hands. Cover and refrigerate for at least 6 hours. Just before cooking, wrap each chicken breast in a rasher of bacon. Your firepit is ready when you should not be able to hold the palm of your hand 5-10 cm (2-4 inches) above the grill for more than 2–3 seconds. Lay the chicken on the grill and cook for 8 minutes. Turn and cook for a further 4-5 minutes, until the chicken is cooked through and the bacon done. Serve the chicken on bread rolls spread with mayonnaise and topped with rocket and tomato.



#### Festive turkey

#### es 4 Saganaki prawns

Serves 4-6

#### Ingredients:

- 1 boneless turkey breast roll (about 1.6kg), skin on
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 tablespoon sea salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 small handful toasted flaked almonds

#### Salsa verde

- 1 bunch flat-leaf (Italian) parsley, chopped
- 24 basil leaves
- 2 anchovies, chopped
- 2 teaspoons salted capers, rinsed and drained
- ½ cup (125ml) olive oil
- · 1 tablespoon lemon juice

**Method:** Remove any wrapping the turkey came in. Rub the skin all over with the oil and sit on a chopping board. Sprinkle with the salt and pepper. Leave for 1 hour prior to cooking (cover with a clean tea towel if you like). Your firepit is ready when you should not be able to hold the palm of your hand 5–10 cm (2–4 inches) above the grill for more than 2–3 seconds. Replace the grill over the firepit and give it around 10 minutes to heat up. Put the turkey on the firepit, skin side down. Cook for 8-10 minutes, until the skin is nicely browned all over. Move the turkey around if the skin is starting to catch and burn. Turn over and cook for a further 10 minutes. Transfer the turkey to a disposable aluminium baking tray. Put another tray on top and fold the edges together to enclose the turkey. Sit the tray on the side of the firepit grill, where it isn't too hot, and cook for 1 hour 15 minutes. After 1 hour, have a peek inside and look at the underside of the turkey. If it is starting to catch or brown too much, move the tray to the furthest edge of the firepit, so it retains heat and continues to cook without burning.

Transfer to a chopping board and rest for 45 minutes. Make the salsa verde while the turkey is resting. To do this, put the parsley in a food processor with the basil, anchovies and capers. Process for a few seconds to finely chop. With the motor running, add the olive oil until well combined. Transfer to a bowl and stir in the lemon juice. Taste for seasoning. Carve the turkey and arrange on a serving plate. Spoon salsa verde over the top of the turkey and scatter with almonds to serve.

#### Ingredients:

- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- · 1 red onion, thinly sliced
- · 6 garlic cloves, chopped
- · 1 teaspoon dried Greek oregano
- 4 tablespoons ouzo
- 2 x 400 g (14 oz) tins crushed tomatoes
- 3 tablespoons tomato paste
- 24 large, raw prawns (shrimp), peeled and deveined
- 250g (9oz) Greek feta, crumbled
- 1 handful chopped flat-leaf (Italian) parsley, to serve
- · Lemon wedges, to serve

**Method:** Heat the olive oil in a saucepan over medium heat. Add the onion, garlic and oregano. Cook for 4–5 minutes, until the onion has softened. Increase the heat to high. Add the ouzo, allowing it to sizzle. When the ouzo has reduced by about half, stir in the tomatoes and tomato paste. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Bring to the boil and cook for just 2–3 minutes. Remove from the heat. This can be made in advance and kept in the fridge for 2–3 days.

Your firepit is ready to cook on when you should not be able to hold the palm of your hand 5–10 cm (2–4 inches) above the grill for more than 2–3 seconds. Put a large cast-iron skillet or ovenproof frying pan on the firepit grill. Give it 10 minutes or so to heat up. Pour the sauce into the frying pan. You want it to be bubbling hot before adding the prawns. Arrange the prawns in the sauce, leaving a bit of space between them. Cook for 5–8 minutes, until pink and just cooked through. Crumble the feta into the pan and cook for another minute. Scatter with parsley and serve with lemon wedges.



(a well- attended fashion show and a birthday celebration), their sights are set on the resort dinner dance coming up on December 18.

"We've had a few false starts with this particular event, thanks to the ongoing lockdowns, but that has just meant we could perfect our performance," says Julian. "We can't wait to get out there."

Ol' Spice has lined up a whopping four hours' worth of music - a rollercoaster of crooning songs for slow dancing (think 'Imagine' and 'Moon River') and amped-up rock tracks that are sure to get attendees out of their seats. A show like this doesn't happen overnight – John and Julian meet up for planning sessions on Monday afternoons, and then dry runs in the resort's theatre on Wednesday afternoons from 2pm until 5pm. They're even using iPads to record backing tracks, both to help them practice individually and to complement their live music - four hours of singing and playing calls for it! The excitement is evident in his voice – after all, they've been waiting months for this. Having played in Sydney nightclubs like Checkers in the 1960s and '70s (as part of a trio called 'The Sandmen') it seems Iulian hadn't realised how much he missed live music until he came to Palm Lake Resort Tea Gardens.

#### Caloundra sounds

"The response from those residents who have joined has been wonderful," says Karen who literally 'found her voice' through music after six years of almost total silence.

"I lost my voice because of a medical issue, but miraculously it returned as a result of me joining a different choir seven years ago. From that experience I totally understood the joy of being able to sing and perform in concerts. And that was something I genuinely wanted to share with the residents and am so happy our choir has been formed."
