ANGLERS ABOUND.

HERE AT PALM LAKE RESORT BALLINA, WE'RE SPOILT FOR CHOICE WHEN IT COMES TO PLACES TO CAST A LINE. KNOWING THIS, A GROUP OF RESIDENT ANGLERS HAVE COME TOGETHER TO FORM A RESORT FISHING CLUB. READ ON TO FIND OUT WHAT THEY'VE BEEN UP TO, AS TOLD BY RESIDENT DOUG STINSON.

Some time ago a number of residents were chatting about the value of having a fishing club here at the resort. We wanted to keep it relatively simple and low key, and encourage anyone interested in any form of fishing to participate. The club would provide opportunities for members to participate in regular fishing outings, liaise with one another to arrange occasional outings and generally offer support and encouragement to one another.

There were a number of boats in the parking lot which were seldom used because the owners had no one to go out with them. The fishing club would encourage members to call on others to join them and perhaps result in better use of their boats. Likewise, there was the possibly that a number of residents would love to go out fishing in a boat but did not have the means to do so. They could team up with other club members who had boats and enjoy some fishing.

Of course, we have encouraged beach and shore-based river fishing as well – we do not want to restrict activities exclusively to boating.

The club has been very successful. We currently have 46 members taking part in our activities as and when they wish. There is no obligation to participate and no cost involved in the membership.

THE NUGGET

Since forming the club we have set up a Clubhouse in the form of a garden shed. It houses our freezer and other equipment. A number of members have formed a syndicate and purchased a four-wheel drive wagon (the Nugget, pictured) that they can use for beach fishing. It is also used to tow boats to the ramps, so syndicate members can avoid getting their own vehicles in the salt water. The costs associated with the wagon are subsidised by regular can and bottle pick-ups from residents for recycling, as well as periodic raffles in the bar.

HITTING THE ROAD

We recently had an enjoyable few days at Glenlyon Dam, out from Tenterfield. Whilst we didn't catch the big Murray Cod we were after we had a wonderful time at the campsite. As I try to explain to members, "It's not all about catching fish – moreover, about drinking and talking about catching fish.

While our fishing results haven't been spectacular (to say the least) we have certainly had a lot of fun trying. Our 'Most Prolific' award must go to Col and Julie Lee (aka, Patches and Mrs Patches) for their regular success at Patches Beach. We have also had some success in crabbing although we do have a lot of difficulty in handling the blighters.

Our next big adventure will be a trip to Iluka. We'll leave on July 18 for four nights, and it should be a ton of fun. Hopefully we can be more successful in the salt water than we were at the dam.

BANDING TOGETHER.

IT ALL STARTED WITH A DREAM – AND A DESIRE TO PLAY THE DRUMS WITHOUT BOTHERING HIS WIFE AND NEIGHBOURS. RESIDENT DENIS LEE TELLS THE STORY OF HOW THE PALM LAKE RESORT BALLINA BAND, 'SPEEDY AND THE TONICS, FEATURING THE TONETTES', CAME TO BE.

THE GENESIS

One would think that, in a small village like Palm Lake Ballina, you'd come across lots of retired musicians (be they amateur or professional) dying to play their favourite instrument. NOT SO! Before my wife Di and I moved into Palm Lake Resort Ballina, we lived on a 22-acre farm in Corndale – there, I had a drum kit. But even with all that space, it didn't take long before Di banished me to the machinery shed 50 metres away from the house in order to continue practising. When we arrived here in February of 2017 – me, with my full kit of drums tucked under my arms – Di warned me that no one would appreciate living next door to a drummer.

I got to thinking: the Oasis Clubhouse has a dance floor and stage. A dance floor and stage require a band. A band means fun for everyone! If I could get a band together, I could play the drums at the Oasis Clubhouse and no one would complain (well, almost no one). I immediately set about advertising, putting a notice up on the noticeboard near the indoor swimming pool. I called for fellow musicians to join me in forming a band and jamming together. I sat by my phone, expecting a flood of phone calls. After brushing off the cobwebs around my shoes I realised that the mission I was on would be like pulling teeth – quite painful! I then tried to get Terri Clark (Home 7) to find out new residents' musical talents when she visited them with her 'Welcome Basket'. I also asked the Sales Consultants to let



prospective residents know of our need for musicians. Still, no one was willing to put up their hand and say "Pick me!"

SUCCESS!

The only thing left to do was ask people who had been dobbed in by their "friends". Finally, in April 2017, the first (nervous but willing) 'Oasis Band' was formed. Initially, it was comprised of Peter Walters (Home 5) on piano, Marianne Rodrom (Home 45) piano, euphonium and ukulele, Denis on drums, Christina Hart (Home 314) as our vocals and acoustic guitar, Steve Horne (Home 118) percussion, Peter Waugh (Home 175) bongos/congas and finally Peter Van Iersel (Home 263) on the electric bass guitar. Our first gig was arranged with Denis Burton, the manager of the Oasis Bar at the time. He organised for us to play during Happy Hour on Friday May 5, 2017 – it was a very nervous affair, but at least we had made a start. After a few more gigs, we worked up to a repertoire of 21 songs which we played at our final gig: the Christmas Dinner on December 20, 2017. After which the Oasis Band wasn't able to continue.

BACK TO THE DRAWING BOARD

Undeterred and with the help of Peter Van Iersel, we were able to reform a new Palm Lake Resort Ballina band by March 2018. We still had Bongo Pete Waugh and Pete Van Iersel, plus the addition of David Taylor (Home 182) on keyboard, and Graeme Speed (Home 88) vocalist. Then a short time later, David Day (Home 134) joined as our alternate drummer, vocalist and sound engineer. We first started rehearsals in the Old Clubhouse and decided that our first job was to think of a new name for the band. After much discussion, we finally agreed that we wanted to act as a 'tonic' for the residents – borrowing from our singer's unusual surname, 'Speedy and the Tonics' were born! Then, to save confusion (we had two Peters and two Davids), we all gave ourselves stage names.

We kicked off with our first gig at the Happy Hour Pizza Night on Friday July 20, 2018. We were told by the bar and some other residents that we were an instant hit, so we thought that this combination just might work successfully. Then, in August 2018, we caught wind of another musician who was moving into Palm Lake Resort Ballina soon. She had 30 years' experience playing violin with country bands. Cheryl and her mum Christine (Home 226) did indeed move in, and Cheryl has been playing and singing with the band ever since. Around the same time, the band and decided to put some money together and buy a sound amplification system to improve our vocal and instrument projection in the Oasis Clubhouse. Thanks to the Residents Committee who repaid us, so that the sound system became the property of Palm Lake Resort Ballina. This allows it to be used by the Residents Committee and authorised residents.

THE BAND IS LOOKIN' GOOD

In October 2018, we gained another new resident by the name of Steve Fizzell (Home 228). His talent for the electric guitar meant 'Speedy and the Tonics' had its newest member. With Peter Van Iersel's earlier addition of a black backdrop and Graeme organising signage for the band banner and the kick drum, we were starting to look the part. The Social Committee asked the band to play at the 2018 Palm Lake Resort Ballina Wednesday Christmas lunch and the Thursday Christmas dinner, and we were happy to provide great dance music during the evening performance. The Social Committee then requested that we play more regularly. The band made the decision to play every second monthly pizza night, starting from February 15, 2019.

A BREAKTHROUGH

Then, in February 2019, a great breakthrough occurred for the band. We were honoured to be asked to play at the Ballina RSL for a charity event called the 'Dementia Music Muster' and had a great time performing. By now we – though especially Steve – realised that we could judge how much residents were enjoying our music by how many dancers were on the floor. This caused us to reassess the songs we were selecting and rehearsing. We started to switch to more up-tempo songs for the dancers; apparently the 'cheek-to-cheek' stuff wasn't appealing to anyone but the most romantic of our residents and there didn't appear to be too many of those!

THE BAND IS COMPLETE

I felt there was something else that could boost our performances: female backing singers. In July 2019, we put out the feelers and hey, presto! Four out of five brave souls decided to join the band after their audition and 'The Tonettes' came into being. Catherine Bechaz (Home 209) came with lots of singing experience, and she organises the girls: Nan Pulsford (Home 214), Sharyn Hogben (Home 203) and Viv Turvey (Home 215). Thus started 'Speedy and the Tonics, featuring The Tonettes' – the next phase of our resident band. Being band leader of 14 strongminded individuals can be a challenge. From time to time, I must remind them all that we're here to have fun and entertain our fellow residents and to not get too serious, especially when it's all



voluntary. Although we have lost some very talented individuals from the band, we have also gained some: our intrepid roadie, Vern Bechaz (Home 209) who is known to be sleeping with one of the backing singers (very rock 'n' roll!), and Fiona Jones (Home 164), our latest backing singer.

The Tonettes have definitely added that extra dimension and they quickly graduated from being backing singers to performing many of the songs we present. 'Speedy and the Tonics' has ended up being the backing band – an interesting turnaround! From my perspective, I find doing the New Year's Eve gigs to be the most enjoyable. It's a light-hearted atmosphere with smiling faces from the audience, especially when forming a conga line towards midnight. Then, we sing the touching 'Auld Lang Syne' at midnight before launching into some fast-paced rock 'n' roll to start the New Year.

THE FUTURE

The band continues to grow and improve. We're keen to find the money to expand the current stage area, add curtains and better stage lighting and improve the sound system. We would also love to add more depth and enrich our sound with a sax, trumpet or trombone player, flautist, harmonica or keyboard player. VET'S WINTER CAUTION_o

OUR DOGS FEEL THE WINTER CHILL JUST LIKE WE DO. SO, WHILE YOU'RE PULLING ON YOUR LAYERS AND DIGGING OUT EXTRA BLANKETS, REMEMBER THAT YOUR PET NEEDS SPECIAL CARE DURING WINTER, TOO. KEEP THESE TIPS FROM PETSTOCK VET DR KATHY MACMILLAN IN MIND.

BEATING THE WINTER BLUES

Just like humans, pets are also at risk of developing the winter blues. Household pets, especially cats and dogs, are highly intuitive and can sense when owners are feeling lazy or unmotivated. Despite being covered in fur, even for our pets it can be tempting to stay cooped up indoors throughout winter. As an owner, staying motivated to maintain your pet's daily exercise regime is critical during the winter months for your pet's mental and physical wellbeing. Playing with your pet indoors or mixing in training sessions is also recommended.

HYDRATION

Keeping your pet hydrated is always important but it is usually something that pet owners are more aware of during the warmer months. Make sure that your pet always has access to fresh water even if it's cool.

DRINKING STANDING WATER

This winter has brought more rain than we're used to and, therefore, more puddles. When you're on your daily walks, monitor your dog closely and avoid letting them drink any standing water. Leptospirosis is an infectious disease that can be contracted by dogs that drink or swim in contaminated water, such as puddles, ponds, rivers or dams. It can cause them to become extremely sick and, in some cases, be fatal. Symptoms include fever, vomiting, diarrhea, refusal to eat, weakness, depression and stiffness. Always take a fresh bottle of water and a travel bowl with you on all outdoor adventures – that way your pet will stay hydrated and will be less likely to pick up unwanted, harmful diseases.

SLEEPING INDOORS

No matter their age, consider allowing your pet to sleep indoors during winter. Not only will they be more comfortable, but they will use less energy maintaining their body temperature. Chilly nights can make the joints of pets suffering from arthritis more painful and breathing cold air can exacerbate respiratory problems such as bronchitis or collapsed trachea. If you have a puppy, this is the perfect opportunity to try indoor crate training and, if you have a senior pet, winter is a great time to invest in a soft, thick bed that will be easy on their joints.

HEATER SAFETY

While it is encouraged to keep your pet indoors more often than not during winter, it is important to ensure they stay safe. If you have a gas heater, have it serviced at the start of the season, prior to using it, to ensure it is not leaking carbon monoxide. And, of course, whether you're using a gas or electric heater, make sure it is always in a safe place where Fido won't knock it over.
