How to feel warm (and fuzzy) this autumn.

SURE, YOU COULD SIP ON HOT CHOCOLATE OR DON A COSY JUMPER TO BEAT THE CHILL THIS COMING WINTER. BUT IF YOU REALLY WANT THAT WARM, FUZZY FEELING, ONE OF THE BEST WAYS IS TO DO SOMETHING KIND FOR SOMEONE ELSE.

Volunteering has long been associated with retirement, but the release of a 2022 research report from National Seniors confirms it. The survey, which asked more than 3600 older Australians to talk personally about volunteering, revealed impressive results.

Half of the respondents stated that they volunteer at least some of the time. Twelve per cent say they volunteer five to 10 hours per week, nine per cent volunteer 10 to 20 hours per week, and two per cent volunteer more than 20 hours per week.

Interestingly, there was little distinction between the amount of volunteer work done by those who had permanently retired from paid jobs, and those who hadn't. Retired or not, senior Australians just love to volunteer. Perhaps it's because, as the report also revealed, many volunteers say it makes them feel more positive and satisfied with how they spend their time.

This is certainly true across the Palm Lake Group of resorts. We are home to countless happy volunteers and volunteering groups. From knitting tiny beanies to donate to babies in NICU, to collecting bottles and cans to raise funds for drought-stricken Australians, hundreds of marginalised people feel the love from our Palm Lake Resort homeowners.

Why not spread more of those warm and fuzzy feelings yourself? Here are four creative ways to volunteer your time...

WHY NOT WRITE TO SOMEONE?



Find a pen pal

Have you heard of the Letterbox Project? The flagship program from Connected AU, the Letterbox Project is national pen pal initiative that focuses on fostering connection and community. It allows you to volunteer some time to send handwritten letters across Australia to people feeling isolated and disconnected. Every single letter (for the duration of the pen pal communication) is sent through the Connected AU team and approved, allowing relationships and connection to thrive while ensuring everyone in their community is safe. Offer your skills as a mentor

By the time we reach retirement, many of us have picked up a few special skills over the years. Maybe you're talented in art and crafts and know your way around a set of knitting needles or a crochet hook? Perhaps you're a professional pianist or artistic painter? Or maybe you love getting your hands dirty in the garden (and regularly reap the rewards in terms of fresh produce or beautiful flowers)? Whatever your skill, chances are there is someone in your community (be that within your Palm Lake Resort community or the greater local community) who wants to learn from you. Consider posting a flyer on your resort noticeboard or in your local paper or Facebook group volunteering your time and expertise as a mentor – you never know who will reach out.

Coordinate a drive

From canned goods to baked treats, handmade items to unneeded items, we can make a big difference when we all

rally together to support those in need. Choose a cause to support – it could be sanitary items for unhoused people in your community, toys for children fleeing family violence or cans of pet food for your local animal shelter – and call on your Palm Lake Resort community to help bring the drive to life. Also, keep your ear to the ground; you just might hear that one of your neighbours is doing it tough, or that one of their friends or a family member might need some support.

This not only provides opportunities for couples with different levels of care to stay close to one another, but also ensures that residents in our aged caring communities feel the love and support of their Palm Lake Resort neighbours.

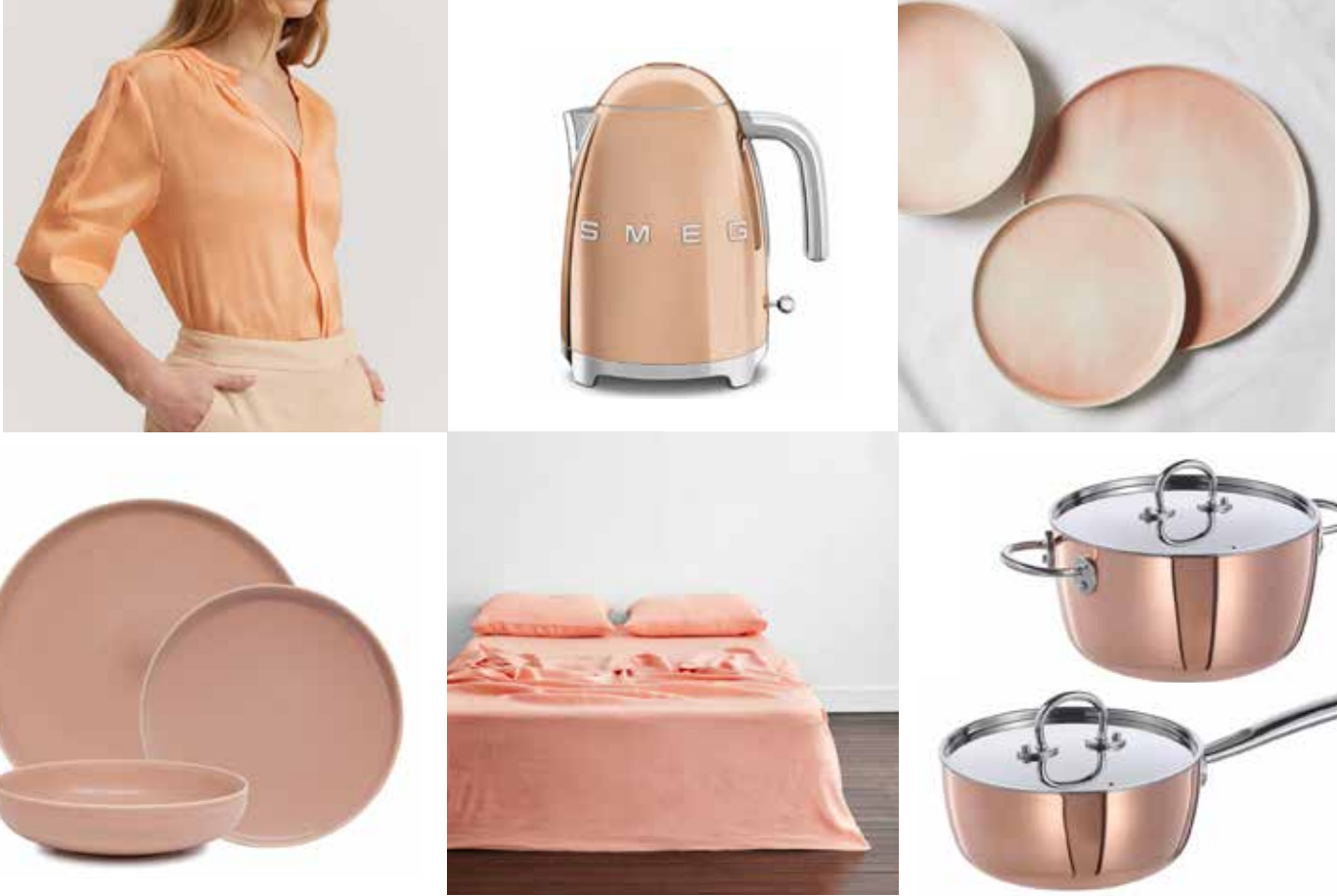

Did you know the international Pantone Colour Institute dates back 60 years and the ‘Pantone Colour of the Year’ celebrates its 25th birthday in 2024? It’s quite the authority on all things colour. Pantone describes the 2024 Colour of the Year, “Peach fuzz”, as a comforting hue “softly nestled between pink and orange” that was chosen to express a yearning for community and cosiness in uncertain times. A colour whose “all-embracing spirit enriches heart, mind and body”.

“At a time of turmoil in many aspects of our lives, our need for nurturing, empathy and compassion grows ever stronger as does our imaginings of a more peaceful future,” Pantone Colour Institute Vice President Laurie Pressman says. “We are reminded that a vital part of living a full life is having the good health, stamina and strength to enjoy it. That in a world which often emphasizes productivity and external achievements, it is critical we recognise the importance of fostering our inner selves and find moments of respite, creativity and human connection amid the hustle and bustle of modern life.

“As we navigate the present and build toward a new world, we are re-evaluating what is important. Reframing how we want to live, we are expressing ourselves with greater intentionality and consideration. Recalibrating our priorities to align with our internal values, we are focusing on health and wellbeing, both mental and physical, and cherishing what’s special — the warmth and comfort of spending time with friends and family, or simply taking a moment of time to ourselves.

“With that in mind, we wanted to turn to a colour that could focus on the importance of community and coming together with others. The colour we selected to be our Pantone Colour

of the Year 2024 needed to express our desire to want to be close to those we love and the joy we get when allowing ourselves to tune into who we are and just savour a moment of quiet time alone,” Laurie explains.

“It needed to be a colour whose warm and welcoming embrace conveyed a message of compassion and empathy. One that was nurturing and whose cozy sensibility brought people together and elicited a feeling of tactility. One whose gentle lightness and airy presence lifts us into the future.”

There are many synergies between Pantone’s thinking and Palm Lake Resort’s approach to people and community. We know our homeowners are at a place in their lives where they cherish special human connections and coming together, while also taking important time out for themselves. More and more, Palm Lake Resort homeowners are also putting themselves first and focussing on their health and wellbeing – our facilities and activities lists are supporting this trend now more than ever.

Tweed River: Around 150 homeowners and guests descending on the resort's Country Club for a stunning art-deco inspired high tea to raise funds for Tweed Palliative Support and the Wedgetail Retreat. The Country Club looked more like a fashionable hotel lounge, reminiscent of The Ritz in London or The Peninsular Hotel in Hong Kong, as fantastic multi-level platters of cakes, scones and savoury treats were prepared and served by the volunteers. Musicians from the Northern Rivers Symphony Orchestra volunteered their time and musical talent to present an incredible classical string concert (pictured above). The high tea was followed by raffles and a lively auction of kindly donated items resulting in more than \$11,000 being raised! This included a donation from the Residents' Committee plus the proceeds of refunds for bottle and can recycling from throughout the year. This total amount was much more than previous annual fundraiser events and much appreciated by the worthy charitable recipient.

Deception Bay: Just before Christmas, the resort's Quilters Group drove up to the Centre Against Domestic Abuse (CADA) at Caboolture with enough goodies to fill three car boots! The CADA people were stunned and so grateful. Along with all the toys for children and necessities for

women, there were 70 handmade Christmas stockings and more than 80 fabric drawstring bags for the women (pictured above). The group also donated 12 quilts to CADA to hand out to their clients in the New Year. The quilters were amazed by the wonderful response from their fellow homeowners who also donated toys and goods.

Upper Coomera: This resort's Jane McGrath Foundation charity fundraiser "Girls' Night In" event raised \$1060.

Bethania and Waterford: Two neighbouring Palm Lake Resorts came together for the sake of breast cancer research, hosting a charity event that raised more than \$3000 for the McGrath Foundation. Everyone turned out in their best pink outfits and a special visit was made by Federal MP Bert Van Manen who also donated to the cause via some lovely hampers that were raffled.
