Meet David.



GROUNDSMAN DAVID CHAMPNEY HAS DEFINITELY MADE HIS MARK ON PALM LAKE RESORT CARINDALE SINCE HE BEGAN HERE IN JANUARY - IN MORE WAYS THAN ONE.

David is proud to tell you that he's a boy from the land. Born and bred in Kingaroy, David's family ran a mixed farm when he was growing up – everything from pigs and cattle to peanuts. It's this 'no-nonsense' country upbringing that has stuck with David his whole life – that, and 4.30am wake ups.

"As kids, we had to use our commonsense or we'd get a kick up the bum," he laughs. "That's stuck with me."

David describes himself as a "jack of all trades" - and he's not kidding. He's spent 26 years working as a butcher, seven years working for his local council in plumbing, and has even spent time as a professional hunter, before the drought forced this boy from the land out to the big smoke in 2007. With multiple skills to fall back on, it was a job at Bunnings Capalaba in the landscaping and gardening section that saw him through the past 16 years, leading up to his job at Palm Lake Resort.

Nowadays, the 60-year-old proud grandfather spends 3.5 days per week at Palm Lake Resort Carindale and the rest of his time with his growing family (that is, when Bunnings doesn't call and want him to fill a shift). Living at Rochedale, David and his wife are proud of their blended family of four children (three are David's) and their stack of grandchildren aged from eight months up to nine years. But what David is really relishing right now are the friendships he's been making with our homeowners.

"I love this job for the people," he smiles. "But also their cooking!"

David explains that he's always being offered freshly baked scones, pikelets, caramel slice and more by our grateful homeowners.

"They always bring out a bottle of water for me or a soft drink when they see me working," he says. "They also know that I love a chat and a joke."

When David's not mowing, whipper snipping, collecting rubbish and generally keeping the grounds neat and tidy, you'll find him spending his rainy Saturdays coming back to the resort to play cards with the homeowner Cards Club. He'll also tell you he doesn't mind popping his head in on the Knitting Group on Tuesdays, or seeing what's happening in the workshop or who's scoring highest at darts. He's even been known to give out 'parking fines' to those homeowners who leave their scooters outside the Grand Hall for too long (fine payments are preferably made in chocolate tarts, he says!). But his most memorable moments are when the homeowners tell him he's doing a great job.

"They've been telling me that the grounds are the best they've looked in six or seven years and that makes me proud," he smiles.

A man of many talents.

You will have read about Palm Lake Resort Fern Bay's 10th birthday in the current edition of our company magazine, *'This is Your Time'*. While the 10th birthday party was a celebration of the resort as a whole, the unofficial 'man of the hour' was homeowner Steve Carroll. Some 86 years young, Steve wrote two poems about his time at Palm Lake Resort Fern Bay (read aloud at the party by Lloyd Hynd) and completed portraits of event guest speakers Amanda Clements (Palm Lake Group's Executive Manager People & Operations) and Meryl Swanson (Federal Member for Paterson). Both were delighted to receive their portraits at the end of the ceremony.

But Steve's talents don't stop at poetry and portraiture. Having served in four wars, he is passionate about working alongside his fellow veterans



to better the lives of those abroad – particularly in Laos, which is home to 15,000 amputees thanks to landmines leftover from the Vietnam War. Steve began collecting prosthetic limbs from clinics in Australia (discarded because regulations say they can't be reused) and sending them to Laos. For the first five years, he did this on his own dime – which, at around \$700 in postage for three boxes soon added up. More recently, he has linked up with another

veteran in Queensland who helps him send the prosthetics to Laos for free. As part of their local Rotary Club, Steve and his wife Doreen have also taken on impressive fundraisers – namely, a motorbike ride around Australia. They rode 20,000 kilometres, slept on the ground of countless Rotary Clubs and raised \$30,000 for malaria research. Yes, the people of Palm Lake Resort really are very special indeed. Well done, Steve and Doreen.

Sharing a cuppa, for charity.

Right across our 27 Palm Lake Resort addresses, we bet there's a jug boiling right now! Coming together over a piping hot cup of tea or a reinvigorating mug of coffee is what we all love best.
