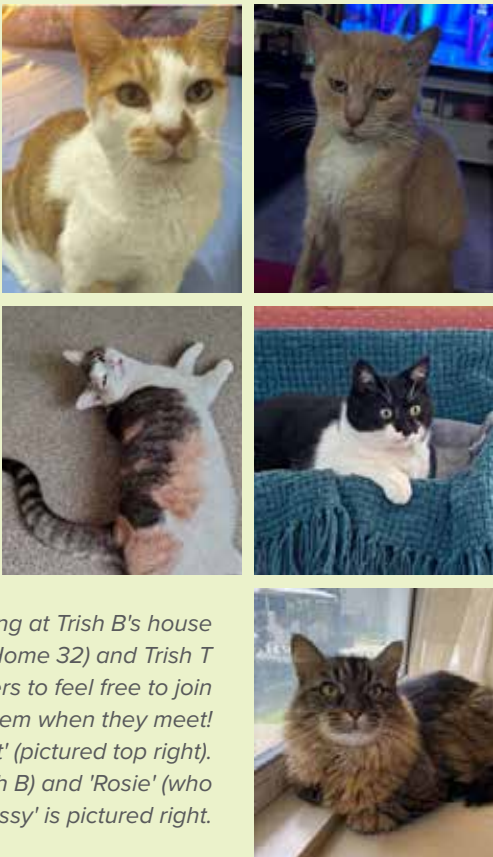
Pictured above: Rex (Home 158) did the 5km charity walk for breast cancer research and wore his best pink tutu. Great work, Rex!

28 years on, we farewell Sylvia.

On Saturday, March 9, Sylvia Troy (Home 31) relocated from Palm Lake Resort Carindale to Saint Vincent's Nursing home in Fursden Road, Carina. It was a difficult decision for Sylvia but her failing health has precipitated the move.

She will be reunited with her long time friend, Joe Leckie, who bought the home behind Sylvia and who has been a resident at St Vincent's for about two years now, with Sylvia a weekly visitor. After spending two weeks in respite, she took up permanent residency just three rooms away from Joe.

Although Sylvia is a private person, she has given me permission to re-publish an article she wrote for the September 2004 edition of Chatter which is her recollection of her first years here. Now aged in her early 90s, Sylvia had lived here at Palm Lake Resort Carindale for 28 years and her memory of events, people and places is remarkable. We wish her all the best for her new adventures!

Memories of the original Palm Lake Resort

It was originally known as "Carindale Palms" when I first visited this village with Joe Leckie in early May 1996. The developers were Des Mitchell and Col Richards. Just four houses had been built – Numbers 2 to 5. A huge macadamia tree was growing in the area where house Number 1 is now built. This tree eventually provided us with lovely macadamia nuts to eat, until the tree was removed for development.

We both decided on a three-bedroom house, choosing the first two corner sites. I moved into the village on August 30, 1996. At this time, house Number 3 was occupied and another house, Number 87, had been built and was also occupied. I found it a bit scary for the first few weeks, having only a few empty caravans remaining to be sold, a dark brick amenities building opposite my house and huge gum trees throughout the village with no lights around.

The only bitumen roads were in front of the four houses and from the boom gate down about 80 metres, so I was surrounded by dirt roads that becoming mud when it rained. Cars could be seen travelling on the Freeway, making it very noisy until the high fence was built. Unfortunately, the beautiful gum trees had to be sacrificed for houses to be built. It was sad that trees that had been growing for many years were felled in only minutes.

Initially, the mail was hand delivered to our homes. A few of us bought letterboxes which soon became 'white elephants'. The existing Mail Box area was our barbecue area and after a Residents' Committee was formed, this also became the venue for monthly meetings. Members were required to bring their own chairs and a 50c donation to pay for any expenses.

“ 'Downsizing' only refers to your house size,” Sylvia says. “There's actually so much more here at the resort - we've got a wonderful clubhouse and recreational facilities.”

“It really is a lovely lifestyle. You can mix with others if you want to - you have the choice. There really is no need for anyone to be lonely. I've made some lovely friends here over the years.”

This Committee was soon to be disbanded. We finally got a swimming pool and the noise fence was partly constructed. The Village Office was where the Hall now stands.

When it rained, a large lake would appear in the middle of the Village, where families of ducks could be seen swimming. Walkers would stop to give way to mother ducks and baby ducks if crossing the roads.

We did have our early problems. On many occasions, pipes etc were damaged whilst drains were being dug and we were without power or water quite frequently. One day, we had our own fountain, with water gushing into the air! If only it could have been oil! Hours later, the plumber finally arrived to correct the problem.

Our builder, David, and his wife (who was the Manageress) lived in the village and each afternoon around dusk, he would light a large mound of rubbish timber from his daily jobs, sit on a chair and watch the fire. Needless to say, black soot would fly around everywhere and it was time to close all the windows. I wondered could he have been a pyromaniac?!

We had snakes coming across Wright Street from the bush and when Jim Newell from Number 86 went for a walk, he would count the number of snakes that had been run over by cars. Some made it though, as I have had five snakes in my garden and that is only the ones I have seen. We also had several generations of water dragons, some of which still remain here, and we enjoyed and encourage them.

Building was a slow process, after three and a half years, just 39 houses were built by Des and Colin. In March 2000, Walter Elliott Holdings bought the unfinished village, completed the remaining 50 houses, made many more changes and improvements, as it is seen today.

Tweed River: Around 150 homeowners and guests descending on the resort's Country Club for a stunning art-deco inspired high tea to raise funds for Tweed Palliative Support and the Wedgetail Retreat. The Country Club looked more like a fashionable hotel lounge, reminiscent of The Ritz in London or The Peninsular Hotel in Hong Kong, as fantastic multi-level platters of cakes, scones and savoury treats were prepared and served by the volunteers. Musicians from the Northern Rivers Symphony Orchestra volunteered their time and musical talent to present an incredible classical string concert (pictured above). The high tea was followed by raffles and a lively auction of kindly donated items resulting in more than \$11,000 being raised! This included a donation from the Residents' Committee plus the proceeds of refunds for bottle and can recycling from throughout the year. This total amount was much more than previous annual fundraiser events and much appreciated by the worthy charitable recipient.

Deception Bay: Just before Christmas, the resort's Quilters Group drove up to the Centre Against Domestic Abuse (CADA) at Caboolture with enough goodies to fill three car boots! The CADA people were stunned and so grateful. Along with all the toys for children and necessities for

women, there were 70 handmade Christmas stockings and more than 80 fabric drawstring bags for the women (pictured above). The group also donated 12 quilts to CADA to hand out to their clients in the New Year. The quilters were amazed by the wonderful response from their fellow homeowners who also donated toys and goods.

Upper Coomera: This resort's Jane McGrath Foundation charity fundraiser "Girls' Night In" event raised \$1060.

Bethania and Waterford: Two neighbouring Palm Lake Resorts came together for the sake of breast cancer research, hosting a charity event that raised more than \$3000 for the McGrath Foundation. Everyone turned out in their best pink outfits and a special visit was made by Federal MP Bert Van Manen who also donated to the cause via some lovely hampers that were raffled.
