

GET SET FOR SUMMER

It has been more than two years since our last notice in 'The Buzz', thanks primarily to COVID. It is nice to be back. Over the coming months, we will begin servicing air conditioners and getting them ready for the anticipated hot summer. We have had to chemical wash quite a few air conditioners in the last few months, removing mould and mildew caused by the very humid summer and extended wet period. During our servicing, we will recommend a chemical wash if required. A large funnel will be attached to the indoor air conditioning unit, then the alkaline chemical will be applied and hosed off under pressure. Lastly, a foam spray will be applied. To keep costs down, we would like to undertake a few services on the same day – please call 0407 310 767 to arrange servicing. Have a cool summer.


Craft Club report.
