BELLEAIR COUNTRY CLUB HAS MADE US ALL PROUD (AGAIN!), SCORING US ANOTHER TOP STATE AWARD FROM A PANEL OF INDEPENDENT CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY EXPERTS.

Palm Lake Resort Forster Lakes continues to go from strength to strength with the Master Builders Association of NSW bestowing a second prestigious state award on our thriving local over-50s community.

Palm Lake Resort Forster Lakes representatives attended a gala black-tie event at The Star Event Centre in Pyrmont in recent months. The 2023 Excellence in Construction Awards saw regional winners across a variety of commercial projects vying for the top state title in their respective categories.

Our \$18 million Belleair Country Club opened earlier this year and has proven a magnet for like-minded homeowners to come together and connect over sporting, social and creative pursuits as well as health and wellness activities. On the awards night, our opulent and beloved community facility took out the category win, named best "Sporting Facility" in New South Wales.

Highly contested in all sectors, the Master Builders Association's awards programs represent the encouragement and promotion of excellence in construction, workmanship, innovation and dedication to the industry across residential, commercial and civil engineering sectors. This is one of the construction industry's oldest awards programs.

Palm Lake Resort Sales Manager Alysia Nechvoglod was on hand to accept the award alongside some of the our Forster Lakes and construction management team members.

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"We knew right from the start of this project that the Belleair Country Club would be a knockout among our homeowners just given how packed full of facilities and luxury features it is," Alysia says.

"This award, judged by a panel of independent construction industry experts, proves that our planning design and construction decisions are right on the money - and we couldn't be prouder."

The awards event celebrated commercial project categories such as "Adaptive Re-use of Historic Buildings", "Refurbishment/Renovation/Extension", and "Industrial Buildings".

The night's overall winner was "Commercial Buildings - \$150 million and over" with 668 Parramatta Square taking home the title.

Belleair Country Club's win is, in fact, a second top gong for Palm Lake Resort Forster Lakes following our popular Carabelle display home being named best in the state in its category during the residential awards evening in September. Carabelle was competing in a category against other display homes after winning the Master Builders Newcastle regional category.







Natural wonders

WHEN IT COMES TO PALM LAKE RESORT ADDRESSES (OF WHICH THERE ARE NOW 30 ALONG AUSTRALIA'S EAST COAST), FORSTER LAKES IS ONE OF THE MOST ENVIRONMENTALLY SPECTACULAR.

Nestled among protected wetlands, Palm Lake Resort Forster Lakes is proud to call the thriving Wallis Lake ecosystem its neighbour.

Palm Lake Works General Manager of Development Suzanne Jensen says her team is acutely aware of the environmental significance of this site – and the gift it is for lucky Forster Lakes homeowners.

"It's a tranquil wetland full of significant vegetation, creating an incredible habitat for wildlife," Ms Jensen says. "This place is a birdwatcher's dream."

Ms Jensen says Palm Lake Works has been working diligently, under the guidance of MidCoast Council, to rehabilitate this parcel of environmentally protected conservation land, which was damaged by its previous owners.

"We work hard to understand the intricacies of the local ecosystem at every one of our new sites before we start any new project and Forster Lakes was no different," she says.

Palm Lake Works' Project Coordinator Jessica Rissman says among the work being carried out at Forster Lakes, around 59,500 tubestock natives will go into the replanting and revegetation efforts.

"While civil works are well underway in Precinct 2 of our resort development, Palm Lake Works' key focus currently is on rehabilitation of the roughly 1.6ha of land on the southern side of Precinct 2, as per our approved Vegetation Management Plan," she explains.

"We're in the process of planting about 8500 flooded gums, broad-leaved paperbarks, swamp mahogany and

red mahogany to create a canopy, with species such as prickly paperbark, willow bottlebrush, Sydney golden wattle and lemon-scented tea tree among those in the additional 17,000 mid-level planting.

"There are around 34,000 ground cover plants going in as well."

Ms Rissman says other environmental protection initiatives have already been carried out.

"We've installed squirrel glider protection fencing and wildlife nesting boxes have also been built and installed."

Ms Jensen says Palm Lake Works is continuing to work with MidCoast Council to research strategies to improve the water quality coming into the project from the upstream catchment, given that water then eventually flows into Wallis Lake.

"We are continually striving to improve our environmental management procedures and environmental policies," Ms Jensen says.

SUMMER HAS ARRIVED AND THE AUTHORITIES ARE PREDICTING ANOTHER LONG, HOT ONE AT THAT. WITH THE HEAT COMES GREATER PRESSURE ON OUR COMMUNITY'S WATER CATCHMENTS. DID YOU KNOW THAT ONE OF THE EASIEST WAYS TO SAVE MONEY AROUND THE HOME, WHILE ALSO PUTTING OUR ENVIRONMENT FIRST, IS TO TAKE A CLOSER LOOK AT YOUR WATER USAGE. HERE'S HOW...

In the **kitchen**

How much time do you spend waiting for the water, running from your kitchen tap, to cool down or warm up? Rather than letting it simply pour down the drain, pop a glass (or even a large bottle) under the tap to collect the water – then, let it cool down/warm up to use however you like. Maybe you can use the water to give your indoor plants a drink? Or fill up the dog's water bowl?

When cooking – specifically, boiling – only use enough water to just cover your food in the saucepan. And always try to defrost frozen food in the fridge overnight rather than under a hot running tap.

But, the biggest water waster, when it comes to kitchen activities, is the clean up. Your dishwasher is the highest consumer of water in your kitchen. You probably know to only run your dishwasher when it's full, but did you know that you can also use the rinse function (if it has one) instead of rinsing your dishes in the sink pre-wash? If you don't use a dishwasher, just be sure to put the plug in the sink when washing up. If you have two sinks, it's a good idea to fill one with water for cleaning and the other with water for rinsing – and go easy on the dishwashing liquid so you don't need to rinse as much!

In the **bathroom**

Much like in the kitchen, it's important to only have the tap or shower running when you're actually using the water. Shaving, brushing teeth and even applying shampoo or conditioner can all be done without the water going – just turn it on to rinse off!

On that same note, while we all love a long, hot shower, this seemingly small luxury comes at a price (and not just financially). Did you know that your showerhead could be using anywhere from nine to 19 litres per minute? It's good practise to find out if your showerhead could be more efficient (and if so, take action) and also simply keep your showers to four minutes or less. Use your phone as a timer if you haven't got a bathroom-specific timer.

Speaking of upgrades, did you know that you may be able to modify the float arm in your toilet to lower the flush volume? There are plenty of tutorials online to walk you through the process, which will have your toilet using less water for each flush (just make sure your pan is suitable for lower flow rates).

Of course, the most important thing to do is to constantly check for leaks – not just dripping taps, but also in your toilet. To check for toilet leaks, add a few drops of dye to the cistern and wait an hour (don't flush). If dye appears in the toilet bowl, you may have a leak.

In the **garden**

A huge portion of your home's water wastage won't actually occur *in* your home. According to a study by Western Australian service 'Water Corporation', sprinklers or irrigation systems account for an estimated 28 per cent of your home's water use. Hand-watering plants takes up another three per cent.

The good news is that being savvy about your water usage inside your home can help you be smarter in the garden, too. Now that you know to collect tapwater while you're waiting for it to cool down or warm up, you can use that on your plants.

When you do need to water your garden using the hose, pay attention to when you do it. The best time to water a garden is in the early morning or the evening, in order to reduce the amount lost to evaporation. Also, be sure to water thoroughly (though less frequently) to maximise the benefit to your plants and use mulch to prevent moisture loss.

If you have the opportunity to plant something new, consider choosing plants that don't require as much water. Australian natives are always a good choice as they're used to the climate (not to mention bursting with colour). Succulents and cacti are other great on-trend options.



Help your pup beat the heat

IT'S HARD ENOUGH BEING A HUMAN DURING THE HEAT OF SUMMER – IMAGINE HOW IT FEELS BEING COVERED IN FUR?! TO HELP FIDO STAY COOL AND COMFORTABLE THIS SUMMER. REMEMBER THESE TIPS.

Bring them with you: It goes without saying, but it's always worth mentioning: never leave your pets in a parked car. Not even for a minute. The temperature can rise rapidly in a vehicle, even when the windows are opened slightly, and the extreme heat can quickly result in organ damage or death. It's just not worth the risk! Bring them inside with you, or leave them at home.

Limit exercise when it's hot: Would you want to go for a long run in the middle of a summer day? Chances are, neither does your pet. Try to schedule their walks or dog park visits during cooler parts of the day – it will be much more pleasant for both of you. If you must walk them during peak temperatures, keep it brief.

Plenty of water and shade: Make sure your pet has easy access to water and shade when they're outside. This might mean investing in a refillable water fountain, or erecting a shade structure if you don't have much natural shade. Air flow is also important, and doghouses aren't ideal in summer (they can actually make the heat worse).

Offer them refreshments: Yes, you read that right! When it's really hot, your pet will love chowing down on ice cubes or even 'pupsicles' (dog-friendly ice blocks which you can make at home). You may also want to purchase a cooling body wrap or vest for your pup, or give them a nice cold bath.

Know the signs of heatstroke: If your dog is suffering from heatstroke, they'll exhibit some scary symptoms. Keep an eye out for heavy panting, glazed eyes, rapid heartbeat, fever, dizziness, vomiting or lack of coordination. If you suspect heatstroke, apply ice packs or cold towels to their head, neck and chest, or run cool water over them and take them to the nearest vet.
