The Springs Country Club is set to become one of Queensland's most sought-after playgrounds for modern over-50s on the Sunshine Coast after its highly anticipated opening in recent weeks.

**EVERYTHING ABOUT THIS** project is truly epic. Five thousand cubic metres of concrete, 280 tonnes of structural steel and 58,000 metres of electrical cable. They're just some of the incredible construction statistics behind The Springs Country Club – our exclusive \$55 million over-50s playground that has just opened its doors to excited Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters homeowners.


Among the features within this 15,000m² striking architectural masterpiece, The Springs Country Club offers the largest over-50s wellness centre in the Southern Hemisphere, a championship seven-rink private bowling green, Palm Springs-inspired pool deck, a whisky bar, piano bar, tenpin bowling alley, gold-class movie theatre, elegant social spaces, creative studios including imported pottery wheels and a kiln, and much more.

Another key feature of this project are the 1000 pieces of bespoke furniture that were each custom designed and manufactured for The Springs Country Club - right down to the custom billiards tables, dart boards and poker tables. Other incredible construction stats on this project include:

- 16,500m² of plasterboard was used to clad walls
- 567,000L of water was used to fill the pools and spas
- 26,000 pieces of stone were individually placed, by hand, on feature walls
- 13,500 tiles were individually laid across 4800m²
- 980 downlights were fitted in the ceilings, alongside dozens of other custom-designed feature light fittings.

As well as being an aesthetic showstopper, The Springs Country Club is designed with the next wave of adaptive, intuitive technologies. For example, smart lighting adjusts to occupancy levels, users' movements, the time of the day and the activity. Motion sensors and switches detect when doors or louvres are opened and instantly shift the air conditioning system to economy mode to prevent energy wastage. And a hefty solar energy system and energy-efficient glazing combine to play a critical role in reducing the building's carbon footprint.

Palm Lake Resort's General Manager of Sales, Alysia Nechvoglod, says the team has been laser-focussed on bringing an iconic design to life here at The Springs Country Club – something truly outstanding and memorable in the over-50s space. Alysia's own personal experience of travelling extensively and living in Orange County, California, in her earlier life has allowed her to see and experience other gated communities and community facilities. She describes The Springs as a true "diamond".

"There's nothing like this country club here in Australia or overseas," Alysia says. "We're constantly told by our homeowners and visitors that The Springs is more akin to a six-star international hotel experience. It's literally breathtaking."

# I'd be lying if I didn't say I shed a few tears...

Palm Lake Works' Construction Manager (National Aged Care and Queensland Facilities) Mick Munro and his team were charged with bringing The Springs Country Club to life. With a career spanning almost 50 years - more than 12 of them with Palm Lake Works - Mick says this has been the "best build I've ever done in my entire life".

"...and I know I'll never do anything like this ever again,"
Mick says. "This has been a project that really got me
excited and got me springing out of bed every morning.
I have to admit that I'm a little bit flat now that it's all over."

"I'd be lying if I didn't say I shed a few tears," Mick smiles.
"It's an unbelieveable feeling to think that I helped to

# ASHLEA BRINGS THE FUN

Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters homeowners' diaries will soon be bursting at the seams not only because of the opening of The Springs Country Club, but also with thanks to a vibrant new face in our team.

**ASHLEA VAN LUENEN** has recently joined Pelican Waters as the resort's Events and Lifestyle Coordinator. Put simply, it's Ashlea's job to bring the fun!

Ashlea comes to the resort with a background in tourism, hospitality and events management spanning a geographic area from Brisbane to Alice Springs to the Sunshine Coast. Most recently, she was responsible for organising events and conferences at Peppers Noosa Resort and Villas.

Ashlea says she's keen to build the momentum already here at Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters and has already expanded our Weekly Activities list to fully maximise the potential of The Springs Country Club now that it's open for all to enjoy. She's eager to bring likeminded homeowners together – whether that's in small group settings to explore shared hobbies and creative interests, or on a larger scale for key social events.

"I'm really keen to watch the community build here – there are new homeowners joining us every week," Ashlea says.
"And it's also going to be amazing to watch this huge building (The Springs Country Club) really come to life."

Ashlea says that while she has many of her own ideas around activities and special events, she will work closely with our homeowners to better understand their sporting interests and favourite hobbies, with a view to bringing those specific activities to the offering, courtesy of The Springs Country Club's epic assortment of world-class facilities. While some activities are complimentary for homeowners, there are also optional additional paid classes available, to add even more depth and variety to the impressive line up.

She says Mirador Wellness Centre is already the place to find wellness activities spanning reformer and mat Pilates, yoga, aqua aerobics, barre classes, sound healing, meditation and mindfulness sessions.

From a sporting perspective, Ashlea has added 'Learn to play table tennis' and 'Learn to play pickleball' classes to the list that also supports social pickleball games on Thursday afternoons. Zumba is held on Thursdays and Dance Class is on Fridays. 'Learn to play lawn bowls' will be the next addition to the list given the convenience of our new championship-grade seven-rink undercover lawn bowls green, with social and competitive bowls events also on the horizon. She also plans to help homeowners learn to tenpin bowl, play pool and more in the future.

In the country club's Cerante arts and leisure precinct, Ashlea says Weekly Activities will span sewing and painting lessons, journalling sessions and puzzle groups. Twice weekly movie screenings and pottery classes have already been added, including pottery wheel throwing and clay hand building (with homeowners' pottery pieces able to be conveniently fired onsite via our specialist pottery kiln).

From a social perspective, the resort now has a fledgling Book Club courtesy of homeowner June as well as an official 'Coffee Catch-Up' time on Mondays, a resort bus trip fortnightly on Wednesdays and there's live music in the Piano Bar on Friday afternoons. Homeowners can also expect themed events like Gatsby-inspired soirees, cocktail masterclasses, trivia nights, live music and much more.

"I look forward to meeting every one of our homeowners and finding out more about them and their personal interests."



While there are such big dimensions and impressively large statistics surrounding The Springs Country Club project, there's been an equally as big focus on the smaller details, too.

**WHEN IT CAME** time to plan and design the detail of The Springs Country Club's impressively large and opulent interior spaces, Palm Lake Resort called on the expert interior design eye of Studio Collective.

The Studio Collective team has overseen many modern, award-winning Palm Lake Resort projects, but even lead Interior Designer Olivia McDonald says she was blown away by the size and scale of this project when it was first mooted almost three years ago.

"It's been amazing to be part of this project from the very beginning," Olivia says. "We were able to really sink our teeth in early and help tailor the design and spatials with furniture pieces and the end result in mind."

Olivia's team liaised with architects to design joinery and proudly custom designed every piece of furniture within The Springs Country Club – some 1000 individual items. Every chair, lounge and table you see here was a detailed Studio Collective drawing, a fabric swatch or a material sample, before it was custom manufactured, delivered and placed in a strategic position. For example, armchairs and banquette lounges have been cleverly designed and expertly positioned to provide a multitude of private moments within expansive open-plan spaces, helping promote conversation and social connection. And that's what superior interior design is about in a community space like this: it's the art – and science – of enhancing the functionality of the space, alongside any obvious aesthetic appeal.

"We always start with the layout and consider how people will flow through the space and what the important

viewpoints are," Olivia explains. "Then we took inspiration from the resort's Palm Springs theme and spent hours upon hours considering shapes and colours."

When it would be easy to choose billiard tables, dart boards and movie cinema seating, for example, from one of many standard ranges, the Studio Collective team instead designed bespoke versions to coordinate perfectly with The Springs' aesthetic. And when we talk about 'big focus on smaller detail', we're talking right down to the embroidered seat numbers on the sumptuous cinema recliners that subtly elevates the luxury feel. Even the light fittings were custom designed by the Studio Collective team.

Looking around The Springs and taking in all the many eyecatching and unique furniture pieces, you have to wonder which of these 1000 bespoke beauties is Olivia's personal favourite design?

"I really love the banquette lounges with ruched detail in El Dorado," she smiles. "And also the striped stone tables on the upper level alfresco deck."

Olivia admits the team was brought to tears upon seeing the finished project.

"It's the biggest project we've undertaken and required such a collaborative team effort," she says. "There were many teary eyes at the end – we are all so proud. We're so grateful to have been entrusted with a project like this that allows us to be so creative.

"All I can say is that the homeowners here are so lucky to live at such an incredible address."

STRIKING A BALANCE between rising construction costs and delivering high quality product is becoming increasingly harder. With whispers and rumours of industry-wide major cost increases heading our way due to an increasing shortage of trades and the added pressure of up-and-coming Olympic projects and data centre projects, the Palm Lake Works team is busy preparing for this next chapter of challenges.

I'm proud to say however, that Palm Lake Works has some incredible long-lasting relationships with many of our major trades and suppliers across the country. This allows us to continue with "business as usual" and maintain the quality of construction that is now to be expected in the Palm Lake Works built home or facility. Many of our trades and suppliers have been consistently working with Palm Lake Works for more than a decade, fostering trusted relationships which we have found helps to fuel efficiency, fair negotiations and top-quality service.

Around the field we are seeing some serious momentum in housing construction as we look to the home stretch of 2025. There's only a handful of homes left to start in the current stages at Forster Lakes, we are nearing completion of Stage 1 homes at Paynesville, and we have completed all homes in Stage 2 and the first of the new home designs in Stage 3 at Pelican Waters.

Palm Lake Works is also gearing up to commence construction of our first aged care community in New South Wales at Forster. We are currently finessing the plans before hopefully starting works toward the end of this year.

Whilst there is still a lot of engineering to be completed before a full program of works can be confirmed, we'll be excited to see this project take full flight next year.

**SO WE ASKED** our local team to reveal some of their favourite local spots and provide their personal recommendations — local insight into things they love and that they know you'll fall in love with, too!

#### Where to eat

**Monique:** For dinner, we love Paradiso Restaurant & Bar. Love the Asian-fusion/sophisticated street food, the vibe and the atmosphere. It's moody and hip and makes you feel like you're in a funky top Melbourne restaurant. My menu favourite include the Betel Leaf Yamba prawns, bao buns, kaarage chicken plus the Crispy pork, sweet chilli, pickled cabbage, peanuts, salad.

For Sunday breakfast, my go-to is The Kiosk. The view, of course, is amazing given it's right on Main Beach. A classic seaside café with great coffee and the best smashed avo.

**Kym:** I love The Mexican as they serve authentic flavours of Mexico. Their farm-to-table menu features dishes made from the freshest locally sourced produce. If you'd like to live on the 'wildside', try their "Vegan's Nightmare" – a share platter of meats for two! I prefer to sit outdoors and

enjoy their casual alfresco dining. Heaters are provided during the cooler months. Also, don't miss Shores Tavern – Yamba's luxury waterfront venue. It's considered the jewel in Yamba's dining crown for good reason! Arrive by car or boat and enjoy lunch or dinner on the Clarence Deck. You can't go wrong with a woodfired pizza or locally caught seafood, fresh off the trawler. If you are enjoying a drop or two, you can always opt to take the courtesy bus home.

#### Where to explore

**Monique:** From Yamba, it's an easy drive to all the beautiful small towns along the river – there are many very close by. Maclean, Ulmarra and Brooms Head are my favourites.

**Kym:** Exploring the local areas within an hour's drive from Yamba is also a favourite of mine. As I grew up in Coffs Harbour, I'm familiar with the smaller towns along our beautiful coastline and enjoy taking our homeowners out on a Friday to visit them, for retail therapy or for a lunch outing.

We recently visited (and loved) Emerald Beach, Rattle Restaurant & Bar which is known for its Mediterraneaninspired dishes, fresh local seafood and the cocktail list. It has been enjoyed by several of our homeowners. A fantastic place for lunch and afternoon drinks.

When in Yamba, you must take the Clarence River Ferry across to Iluka. The journey takes about 30 minutes and the ferry departs from the end of River Street in Yamba and arrives at the Iluka Boatshed. You get to take in the beautiful scenic views of the Clarence River, including birdlife and dolphins, and you can even take your fur baby along for the ride.



#### What to do

#### Where to eat

Jess: Sardine Dining is my favourite eatery in Paynesville. Mark Briggs, the owner and chef, has worked in Michelinstarred restaurants and ran the Vue de Monde kitchen for four years before moving to East Gippsland and opening Sardine Dining. Mark is passionate about showcasing local produce and works closely with local farmers and fishermen to supply the restaurant. Sardine Cantina is next door; it's a relaxed wine bar that I love visiting with my girlfriends to share a bottle of local wine and a cheese platter.

#### Where to explore

Jess: We love the Raymond Island Koala Trail walk. It's common to see other wildlife like kangaroos, echidnas and many beautiful native birds. The Den of Nargun is one of our favourites to explore — a slightly challenging hike over rocks and fallen trees in a stunning rainforest setting and waterfall along Dead Cock Creek.

Jo and Troy: We also love getting on the ferry to Raymond Island - two minutes and you're there. There's something special about seeing koalas in their natural habitat and not just in a zoo. If you're lucky, you'll see them munching on gum leaves or swapping trees. We take anyone who comes to visit us over there - it's wonderful! From September to February is a great time to see the baby joeys with their mums in the trees. Another one of our favourite spots to explore is 90 Mile Beach. Five minutes by boat and a short walk over the sand dunes and you're standing on kilometres of beach. We're shocked that most of the time no one else is there - you have all of it to yourself and it's breathtaking!

#### What to do

Jo and Troy: When in Paynesville you must go snorkelling and paddleboarding on the waterfront. It's waist-deep for roughly 20 metres which makes it perfect for families and paddle boarding. You just have to weave through the families of black swans that live here in Paynesville - they live at the waterfront and swim right alongside you! When you're there, it's just a quick nip across the road for coffees and ice cream. Another local must-do is boating and exploring the extensive lake system that's right on our doorstep - we're blown away by the beauty of this area.

# SILVER MILESTONE

Our Carindale resort has just marked a major milestone - 25 years of operation under the Elliott family's 'Palm Lake Resort' banner. To mark the occasion, a commemorative publication was unveiled at the party last month.

HOMEOWNERS PATRICIA BENSON and Elaine McClure volunteered to research and coordinate information from long-time homeowners for the "Celebrating Our History" magazine – a nostalgic review of 25 years of Palm Lake Resort. There were even some earlier memories included that preceded the March 24, 2000 date when Walter Elliott Holdings Pty Ltd purchased the complex which was then known as "Carindale Palms".

At the party, Palm Lake Resort Liaison Manager Keith Arnfield presented certificates to 'original' homeowners to recognise their lengthy occupancy of 25+ years including:

- Amanda Newell (the longest residing homeowner)
- Victor and Janice Cook
- Trevor and Dawn Manson
- Noelen Parkes.

The Mansons moved into the "village" on March 10, 2000.

"We had been looking to downsize and came across Carindale Palms for 'over 40s' a stone's throw from where we were living previously," Dawn says.

"We loved what we saw. We put down a \$100 deposit on Home 42. We picked out the three- bedroom home design and in three months we moved in."

Trevor says the their home was the last to be built by the property's previous owners, before Palm Lake Resort took on ownership.

"Our village of 89 homes grew to 185 homes," he says.

"Much has changed in that time. People have come and gone. But life is never boring as we have many interesting activities and entertainment here to keep us occupied." The Cooks also have vivid memories of their earliest years at Carindale Palms.

"There was so much wildlife - including hares running around the paddocks and plovers building nests where the rest of Stage 1 is now," Vicotr says. "We had gravel and dirt roads outside our house when we first moved in and just a wire rundown fence along Wright Street."

Janice recalls a time, during the installation of water from north to south, a big trench was dug up for all units backing onto Wright Street.

"Planks were put down for homeowners to gain access to their homes and yellow ribbons were displayed denoting 'Caution'. During this installation, a mains water line was hit sending water gushing high into the air which was quite spectacular," she says.

Carlene Labudda was another of the earliest homeowners.

"My husband and I moved into the complex in March 2000," Carlene recalls. "Our house had to be moved forward to make way for the Freeway sound barrier fence. The Elliotts accommodated us at the Colmslie Motel for two or three days while this happened.

"Scott Elliott discovered my husband was a keen golfer and asked him to give lessons to some of the other homeowners here which he did for a time, in the paddock which is now Stage 2. I have been happy living here for more than 25 years."

While she played a big role in the compilation of the 25 years commemorative publication, Palm Lake Resort Carindale homeowner Patricia Benson also MC'd the silver anniversary party.

"It is not just the 185 homes, the social and sporting facilities, the roads, plumbing, gas lines and electrical cabling that make up this resort," Trish told the homeowner crowd. "They are simply the building blocks of our existence here. The true mortar of what binds these bricks together - what gives them life - is you. The homeowners. You are the heart of our community.

"It is your spirit, your generosity and compassion, and a willingness to help your neighbour, which enables us to continue on life's journey as independently as possible," she says.

"This is a place where strangers meet and become friends. People will forget what you say, forget what you do but they never forget how you make them feel.

"Today I feel proud to be a member of this community. Proud to have assisted Elaine over the past two years working towards presenting this historical magazine and lastly, proud to call you all my friends."



#### Glasshouse tomato sourdough panzanella

#### Ingredients

300g day-old sourdough bread 350g mixed tomatoes, such as roma (plum), cherry, oxheart and mortgage lifter

50g kalamata olives, pitted

30g capers

20g basil leaves

3 teaspoons marjoram leaves

60ml balsamic vinegar

50ml extra virgin olive oil

#### Method

Tear the bread into 2-3cm pieces and toss into a large bowl. Slice the tomatoes and add to the bowl, then stir through to release some of the tomato juices for the bread to soak up.

Add the olives, capers, basil and marjoram and stir through. Drizzle with the vinegar and olive oil. Season to taste with salt and black pepper and stir through again to ensure the balsamic and olive oil have been taken up by the bread. Allow to sit for a few minutes before serving, so the flavours

#### Baked pasta shells stuffed with almond ricotta & roasted tomatoes

#### Ingredients

700g tomato passata (to make your own, see Page 134 of 'A Plant-Based Farmhouse')

300ml water

200g conchiglioni pasta shells (about 24 shells)

250g almond ricotta (to make your own, see Page 227 of

'A Plant-Based Farmhouse')

1 teaspoon pink peppercorns

3/4 teaspoon salt, to taste

20ml extra virgin olive oil

#### Method

Preheat your oven to 200°C. Have a large baking dish at



the ready — ideally one measuring about 30cm x 24cm, and about 8cm deep.

Mix the tomato passata and water together in a bowl, then pour half the liquid into the baking dish. Using a teaspoon, fill the uncooked pasta shells with the almond ricotta. Arrange the filled shells in the baking dish, facing upwards, to keep the ricotta in place, and making sure the pasta shells fit snugly.

Gently pour the remaining tomato passata mixture in and around the pasta shells. Do this as slowly as you can, to avoid disrupting the ricotta too much. The liquid should just cover the tops of the filled shells. Sprinkle the pink peppercorns and salt over the top and cover the baking dish with foil.

Turn the oven down to 190°C and bake the shells for 1 hour. Carefully remove the foil and bake for a further 10-15 minutes, or until the shells are starting to colour along their edges. Remove from the oven and allow to sit for 10 minutes before serving, giving time for the pasta to absorb any residual liquid. The tomato sauce should be lovely and thick around the cooked shells. Drizzle the olive oil over the cooked shells and serve.

#### Rye, chocolate & beetroot cake with chocolate mousse creme

#### Ingredients

110g beetroot, peeled and grated 110g rapadura sugar

150ml soy or almond milk 55ml extra virgin olive oil

40g maple syrup

2 teaspoons vanilla bean paste

125g rye flour

50g raw unsweetened cacao powder

30g almond meal

½ teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda (baking soda)

1 teaspoon apple cider vinegar

For the chocolate mousse creme:



2 avocados 155g maple syrup 75g raw unsweetened cacao powder 2 teaspoons vanilla bean paste ½ teaspoon salt

#### Method

Preheat your oven to 180°C. Line the base of a 20cm springform cake tin with baking paper and grease the inside of the tin with olive oil.

Put the grated beetroot in a food processor with the sugar, milk, olive oil, maple syrup and vanilla paste. Blitz until smooth. Add the remaining dry ingredients to the food processor and blitz again.

Pour the mixture into a bowl and use a spatula to quickly but evenly mix the vinegar through. Don't worry if you see white streaks — it's just the vinegar reacting with the bicarbonate of soda and baking powder, and it's a good thing!

Immediately pour the batter into the cake tin and bake for 30-40 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Remove from the oven and leave to cool in the tin for 10 minutes, before turning out onto a wire rack.

While the cake is baking, make the chocolate mousse cream. Peel the avocados, remove the stones and scoop the flesh into a high-speed blender. Add the remaining ingredients and blitz until smooth and creamy. Leave in the fridge until you are ready to ice the cake.

When the cake is completely cool, smooth the icing over and decorate with your choice of flowers or foliage. Any leftover cake will keep in an airtight container for 2-3 days.

#### Cucumber Elderflower Fizz

Crisp and cooling, with floral notes that feel like a spring garden in a glass.

#### Ingredients

4 cucumber slices

15ml elderflower cordial (or syrup)

15ml fresh lime juice

45ml gin (optional)

Sparkling water (or light tonic, for more bite)

#### Method

Lightly muddle cucumber slices in the base of a shaker.

Add elderflower. lime juice, and gin (if using). Shake briefly with ice.

Strain into a chilled highball glass with fresh ice.

Top with sparkling water or tonic.

Garnish with cucumber ribbons and edible flowers.



A refreshing, garden-style sip that balances sweetness with herbal lift.

#### Ingredients

3 fresh strawberries, hulled and sliced 3-4 fresh basil leaves

15ml honey syrup (1:1 honey + hot water)

20ml fresh lemon juice

45ml gin (optional)

Soda water, to top

#### Method

Muddle strawberries and basil gently in a shaker.

Add honey syrup, lemon juice, and gin (if using). Shake with ice. Fine strain into a tall glass filled with ice. Top with soda water and stir gently.

Garnish with a basil sprig and a halved strawberry.



#### Peach & Thyme Spritz

Juicy stone fruit paired with aromatic thyme sunshine in a glass.

#### Ingredients

1/2 ripe peach (or 60 ml peach nectar) 10ml agave or sugar syrup (adjust to taste)

2 sprigs fresh thyme

20ml fresh lemon juice

45ml gin (optional)

Sparkling wine (for a cocktail) or sparkling grape

juice (for a mocktail), to top

#### Method

Muddle peach with thyme in a shaker.

Add syrup, lemon juice, and gin (if using). Shake with ice.

Fine strain into a wine glass with ice.

Top with sparkling wine or sparkling grape juice.

Garnish with a thyme sprig and peach slice.



# ETERNAL BLOOMS


The only downside to cut flowers? Their short lifespan. But there's a more permanent solution that's making its way back into our homes, beloved for its charm, longevity and cost-effectiveness.

THE ART OF drying flowers has a surprisingly long history, dating as far back as Ancient Egypt and becoming particularly popular in Victorian England. While they fell out of fashion for a time, dried flowers are enjoying a resurgence, with modern florists and home stylists embracing their rustic charm and sustainability. This revival has reminded us that dried flowers are not only practical and enduring, but also a stylish way to bring the outdoors in.

#### The best flowers for drying

You don't need a large garden to enjoy flowers that dry well. Many can be grown quite happily in pots on a patio, balcony, or even by a sunny window. Try these favourites:

- Lavender: Its soothing fragrance lasts for months.
- Statice: Known for its brilliant colours that hold beautifully once dried.
- Everlasting daisies: Hardy natives with papery petals.
- Roses: Smaller buds and fragrant varieties dry



Drying flowers is a simple and satisfying pastime, with different methods to try:

- Air drying: Gather small bunches, tie the stems with string and hang them upside down in a cool, dry place away from sunlight for two to three weeks.
- Pressing: Ideal for smaller or more delicate blooms such as pansies. Place between sheets of absorbent paper under a heavy book for several weeks.
- Silica gel: Available from craft shops, this helps to preserve flowers in a more natural shape and colour.


Once dried, flowers should be kept out of direct sunlight to prevent fading. Arrange them in vases, weave them into wreaths, or frame your pressed blooms for an everlasting work of art.









