The spice of life.

TO THE REST OF THE WORLD, THEY'RE JOHN DAVIES AND JULIAN LITTMAN. BUT TO RESIDENTS OF PALM LAKE RESORT TEA GARDENS – AND THE WIDER MYALL RIVER COMMUNITY – THIS INIMITABLE DUO IS KNOWN AS OL' SPICE.

Five years ago, lifelong musicians Julian and John came together to form our resort's very own band. Dedicated to performing for the community – not just to the community – they decided naming their new duo would be a community effort, too.

They put the call out to their fellow Palm Lake Resort Tea Gardens residents to help them come up with a name – a very brave move indeed.

"Some of the names put forward included 'Salt and Pepper' and 'Shades of Grey,'" says John with a laugh. "Our personal favourite, though, was 'Old Spice'. And the rest is history!"

As they often joke, John and Julian like to leave it up to the crowd to decide who is the ol' and who brings the spice.

Both gentlemen have long histories with music, playing in various groups – and donning various costumes – over the years. Many residents have heard whispers of past performances in gold suits, though we're yet to see any photographic evidence to substantiate these rumours.

Having performed in a trio called 'The Sandmen' in iconic Sydney venues through the 70s and 80s, Julian felt sure his days on stage were behind him. But when he moved into Palm Lake Resort Tea Gardens and met John (who was putting his 40 years of musical experience to good use behind the scenes with the resort choir) he decided to dust off his bass guitar for an encore.

"It was the last thing I expected to happen to me in a retirement community, but it's been the best," Julian told us in a previous edition of Tea Time.

Over the years, Ol' Spice have added countless songs to their repertoire. And while they each have their specialties (John on piano and keyboard, Julian on the bass guitar –

the same kind Paul McCartney plays) it's their singing that sets them apart.

Twice a month, residents can come along to watch the band practice in the resort theatre. These jam sessions, held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month from 2pm to 5pm, are a chance to enjoy three hours of great tunes and good fun.

These rehearsals help Ol' Spice stay ready for their many performances. John and Julian graciously give up their time to play at many of our resort activities and functions, including the recent Melbourne Cup Day celebration held in the Promenade. From soft background music to catwalk tunes and rock 'n' roll for the pre-race entertainment, their ability to soundtrack any occasion was on full display.

But you don't need to be a Palm Lake Resort Tea Gardens resident to enjoy their musical stylings. Ol' Spice performed at the Myall River Fair over the recent October long weekend. The streets were packed, and the band had plenty of support from friends, family and resort neighbours – creating a Palm Lake Resort Tea Gardens-style Mexican wave!

A hot commodity, Ol' Spice has already been snapped up for the resort bowls club Christmas party. You can expect to see them at many other functions in the lead up to – and during – the festive season. They are even available to perform for private functions and have done so on many occasions.

John and Julian, thank you for sharing your musical talents with us and supporting our resort's calendar of events. We are so grateful for the entertainment and musical memories you've given us so far, and we look forward to many more.

Indoor games

Dominoes: Each player starts with seven dominoes. The remaining dominoes are placed face down. The first player places a domino with a matching number of dots (e.g., a 6-6). The next player must add a domino that matches one of the numbers on the open ends of the chain. If a player cannot play, they must draw from the pile until they find a playable piece. The game continues until one player uses all their dominoes or no more plays can be made. The winner is the person who runs out of dominoes first.

Knuckles/Jacks: Scatter the knuckles on the ground. The first player tosses the ball into the air, quickly picks up one knuckle, and catches the ball before it hits the ground. The player continues picking up one knuckle at a time. After clearing all knuckles, the player moves on to picking up two at

a time, then three, and so on. The game ends when a player fails to pick up the right number of knuckles or drops the ball.

Marbles: Draw a circle (about one metre wide) on the ground and place a few marbles inside. Players take turns flicking their "shooter" marble (a larger marble) at the smaller ones, aiming to knock them out of the circle. If a player knocks a marble out, they get to keep it and take another turn. The game continues until all the marbles have been knocked out. The player with the most marbles wins.

Outdoor games

Yo-Yo: To start, hold the yo-yo in your hand with your palm facing up and the string wrapped around your middle finger. Throw the yo-yo downward with a flick of your wrist, letting it unwind and "sleep" (spin) at the bottom. Give the string a small tug to bring the yo-yo back to your hand. As you get comfortable, you can try simple tricks like "Walk the Dog" (letting the yo-yo roll along the ground) or "Around the World" (spinning the yo-yo in a circular motion).

Handball/Four Square: Stand a few feet away from the wall and hit the ball against it using the palm of your hand. The ball must bounce once on the ground before hitting the wall, and the other player must return it after it bounces once on the ground. Play continues as long as players can keep hitting the ball back and forth. If a player misses, lets the ball bounce more than once or hits the ball out of bounds, the other player earns a point.

Elastics: Tie a long piece of elastic into a loop. Two people stand inside the elastic, stretching it around their legs at ankle height to form a rectangle. The third player jumps over and on the elastic in a sequence, chanting a rhyme (e.g., "England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales..."). As the player succeeds, the elastic is moved higher, first to knees, then hips, etc. The aim is to complete the jumping pattern without touching the elastic incorrectly or missing a jump.

Deception Bay quilt club turns 20.

Palm Lake Resort Deception Bay's quilters have just celebrated an impressive milestone: 20 years of togetherness AND an incredible number of quilts produced for charity...

"Our numbers have waxed and waned over the years, but we've always had around 12 regulars to our Saturday morning get-togethers," explains quilt group members Dawn and Jan. "In the early days, we all just shared our knowledge of quilt making and enjoyed the chats. But in 2008, we began handing out quilts to homeowners within our resort who we had been advised had moved into care. We also gave some quilts to Palm Lake Care when they first began operating.

"In early 2020, we became aware of the dreadful fires down in the Bega area of New South Wales. A call out for some more members to make quilts for those affected resulted in over 100 quilts making their way down to fire victims."

While COVID limited things in 2020 and 2021, members continued to quilt at home. They also made hundreds of masks that were sold both within the resort and outside, helping to raise funds for the purchase of backing fabrics, wadding and other requirements.

"For some time now we have also been donating quilts to various charities and we will continue to keep spreading the goodwill," the pair says.

And you won't believe the numbers. Here's a snapshot of the almost ONE THOUSAND quilts that have been produced and donated by the group over the years:

- Deception Bay Neighbourhood Centre: 350
- Drought Angels, Chinchilla (now "Farm Angels"): 260
- Palm Lake Resort homeowners going into care: 170
- Palm Lake Care: 30
- Bega Fires: 100
- Centre Against Domestic Abuse Caboolture: 75
