One of the most highly anticipated dates of 2023 has just been announced and you're going to want to put this one in your golfing diary.

SATURDAY, JULY 1. After years of work, that's the day that the reconfigured Pelican Waters Golf Course will be officially re-opened to the public.

Pelican Waters Golf Club Head of Golf Dale Williamson says while the reopening of the renovated 18-hole championship course will no doubt be the hottest topic in Sunshine Coast golfing circles, July 1 will also be the official opening date for Greg Norman's world-first mini golf course, also on site.

"We are so glad Greg and his team chose Pelican Waters Golf Course to be the location for his world-first sporting facility that will make the game of golf accessible to anyone and everyone, no matter what your age or golfing ability," Dale says.

Come July 1, there will also be access to the club's purposebuilt short game area as well as dining options within the

new restaurant, function room, main bar, Sports Bar and fully licensed café.

"With construction continuing on our main facilities, we will not be offering any memberships at this time," Dale explains. "It will instead be a 'pay as you play' system. Yearly golfing options and timelines will be released in time to come."

Dale says the course and clubhouse will be open seven days a week, as of July 1. Golf bookings will open one month prior to the re-opening date.


Under the 'Pay as you play' system, there will be three levels of pricing: public, associated players and Juniors (under 18s). You can choose to play nine or 18 holes with included cart fees. A game of mini golf will cost a flat \$15 per player (adults and children).

"For those who have been asking, our normal golfing calendar will be operational in line with the course reopening. We are anticipating that the driving range, with the new coaching facilities and undercover bays, will come online later in the year."

DEVELOPMENT UPDATE WITH SUZANNE JENSEN General Manager, Development

WE ARE SEEING some serious traction around our key projects this year. Here's a rundown of our current construction sites, across the country:

Palm Lake Resort Pelican Waters: Our Sales Executives have now moved into their brand new Sales Information Centre within Pelican Waters Golf Club's clubhouse. Final touches are being put on the renovated clubhouse with only the landscaping left to be completed. This building is looking amazing and unrecognisable from the original golf clubhouse! Civils works for Stage 1 of the resort continue with the civil team now busy pouring all the concrete roads. Homes in Stage 1a started construction in January with an expected completion of first homes in June 2023. The Greg Norman-designed short game area works are complete and now in their 'grow-in' period. Construction of the Greg Norman-designed mini golf course is underway and expected to be complete in May 2023. Design of the new coaching centre and driving range is now being developed with works expected to commence late this year.

Palm Lake Resort Yamba Cove: All civil works are now complete ready for the construction of homes and the clubhouse to commence in April 2023. There's more information about Yamba Cove on Page 17 - we're really excited about this boutique project.

Palm Lake Resort Paynesville: Again, you can read all about this project on Page 17. Our team is very much looking forward to working with local trades and suppliers

in regional Victoria, an area Palm Lake Works is yet to explore. We will be employing hundreds to tradesman in this small regional town, which makes us proud.

Palm Lake Resort Bargara: Home construction for Stages 10-14 continues and we are expecting this resort to be fully constructed by June 2023. In some breaking news, a town planning application is pending approval for a further extension of this resort - we await Bundaberg Regional Council's decision. This proposed extension includes 100+ homes and further recreational facilities for all homeowners of this resort to share. If approved, Bargara will become the biggest resort in our company's portfolio.

Palm Lake Resort Forster Lakes: The Belleair Country Club is now open and you can see from our photos on Pages 11-13 that it is an impressive facility to match this impressive location. Construction of the bowls green and Sports Club have now commenced and are expected to be complete by early 2024. Civils works for the next stages in Precinct 2 have now also commenced - these works will continue throughout 2023 and into 2024. Homes continue to be built in Stage 11 with Precinct 2 works to continue from May.

Palm Lake Resort Old Bar Beach: The concept designs for this site are well and truly underway and our team is excited to be designing our first ever beachfront country club - it will no doubt be a stellar community hub. We are planning 500+ homes across three distinct precincts here at Old Bar Beach as well as a new golf course.

HUR Australia gyms are currently found in three Palm Lake Care communities including Beachmere, Toowoomba and the newly opened Caloundra location. As HUR explains, their equipment is silent, smooth and automated. There are no cables to trap fingers, no uncomfortable and ill-fitting seats, no over- or under-exercising - just easy and motivating exercising that is suitable for all.

Palm Lake Care Beachmere Service Manager Ram Korla says his HUR gym has been a popular addition to their luxury waterfront aged caring community, just north of Brisbane.

"It's been very nice to see our residents using the HUR equipment for exercise – it's a great asset to our community," Ram says. "In my opinion, the best part about the HUR system is that it accommodates the exercise requirements of every single one of our residents – from mild to more intensive training."

Ram says Palm Lake Care Beachmere's HUR gym was open 24-7 for those residents able to train without supervision, while physiotherapists were also employed to oversee the training of residents who needed a little more support.

Encara's Mohamed Samir is one of the physiotherapists who works at Palm Lake Care Beachmere to assist residents on their wellness journey (Encara is Palm Lake Care's allied health partner across all our care communities). Mohamed has 10 years' experience as a physiotherapist, across a number of different countries, and is a firm supporter of HUR Australia's gym system.

"HUR has made it really, really easy for us to support those residents in wheelchairs and others who rely on wheelie walkers or have other mobility issues," he says. "One of the greatest advantages of the HUR gym is its online system that keeps track of our residents' training regime and exercise progress even when we're not there on-site overseeing the training."

Mohamed says one of the major focuses for him and the other physiotherapists and physio assistants at Palm Lake Care Beachmere is fall reduction – a common problem among the elderly population. He says HUR cross trainers are helping to improve residents' coordination and, together with other HUR equipment that focuses more specifically on balance, there's been marked improvement in Palm Lake Care Beachmere's fall statistics.

In one particular case, Mohamed says his team worked with a "frequent faller", targeting coordination and balance issues. In less than three months of training in Palm Lake Care Beachmere's HUR gym, this resident enjoyed a "significant reduction" in falls – and therefore increased quality of life.

CHRIS SUTTON, OF Beachmere Sands, will tell you she's on the "80 side of 70" and she's been quilting for 40 years or so. She describes herself as an "old-chook quilter" and has been teaching beginners' quilting classes within her Palm Lake Resort community and with the U3A Beachmere group for some time.

"I'm not an expert quilter," Chris says. "Far from it. Every day is a learning day for me. A previous generation of quilters taught and mentored me. Teaching other beginners, older 'newbies', is my way of giving back. However, the more I teach, the more concerned I am that we are losing our older quilters. We need our older quilters to teach their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren... and it keeps them young."

As Chris explains, there is powerful evidence-based research, "too powerful to ignore", that proves quilting is a desirable and valuable activity to brain health, wellbeing and maintenance of social ties and independence as we age. Neurologists and specialists in ageing commend quilting's benefits. However, try as we might, we can't control the physical effects of age on our body. For some, physical ageing can be a challenge, if not a barrier, to continuing to quilt.

"The good news is, that doesn't have to stop you doing what you love," Chris explains.

In her new book, You're Never Too Old To Quilt, Chris presents a guide for those who struggle to keep quilting, and those who want to learn to quilt but, experiencing physical challenges, have been hesitant to try. "Did you know, there are rulers designed to make it virtually impossible not to cut a straight line, even if you have a slight hand tremor? There are cutters that take all the pressure off arthritic hands and sore wrists and there are even digital cutters that do it all for you.

"(The book) is a 'How to quilt if, like me, you're an old chook or a tough old rooster with a sore body'," she laughs. "It's also for spring chickens who wants to stay that way for many years to come!"

Gregory's chicken

Cook's note: An easy, delicious recipe that brings the flavours of Queensland to the table.

Ingredients

8 chicken thighs 1kg mushrooms, sliced 1/2 packet cream of mushroom soup 1/2 packet French onion soup 1 large onion, halved and sliced 1 1/2 cups dry ginger ale Salt and pepper, to taste 1 tin pineapple rings 2 tomatoes, cut in half 2 rashers of trimmed bacon, cut into 4 pieces per rasher Rice, cook enough for 4 people.

Method

Preheat oven to 180°C.

1. Combine ginger ale and soups, mix well.

2. Place chicken thighs in oven proof dish.

3. Spread mushrooms and onions over the top of the thighs.

4. Pour over the ginger ale and soup mixture.

5. Bake in moderate oven basting with pan juices for 1 hour or until chicken is cooked.

6. Drain pineapple rings and place in ovenproof dish.

7. Place halved tomatoes on top of pineapple rings.

8. Arrange bacon on top of tomatoes.

9. Put a dob of butter on each.
10. Bake with chicken, remove when tomatoes are cooked.

Serve on a bed of rice.

Nanna's cottage pie

Cook's note: This recipe is at least three generations old. It has been a great favourite of my grandchildren, being a cold weather staple for after-football dinner. If you don't want to use mashed potato for the topping, pasta or mashed cauliflower are suitable substitutes. The cottage pie below has a mashed cauliflower topping.

Ingredients

500g beef mince and oil to sauté 1 onion 1 carrot 1 cup beef stock Dash of Worcestershire sauce 2 teaspoons tomato paste 2 teaspoons cornflour 4 large potatoes Butter, salt and pepper



Method

1. Chop onion and carrots into 1cm cubes.

- 2. Take a large pot and sauté onion until translucent.
- 3. Add mince and fry until browned, breaking into grains with a wooden spoon as it cooks.
- 4. Add carrots, stock, sauce, tomato paste, salt and pepper.
- 5. Simmer gently, lid on, for 40 mins. Thicken with cornflour (mixed with a little cold water).
- 6. Meanwhile, cook and mash the potatoes, season to taste with salt and pepper, put to one side.
- 7. When the meat base is cooked through and the carrots are tender, pour the mixture into the bottom of a heatproof casserole dish. Cover entirely with mashed potato. Smear butter over the potato crust and brown under the grill. Serve with a green vegetable.

Vegetarian & diabetic-friendly slice

Cook's note: Some people have food intolerances or for a variety of reasons don't eat meat. If you eat with or cook for them regularly, it makes sense you would make the effort to ensure they're included. With the substitution of gluten free SR flour, this is an ideal way to cater to almost everyone.

Ingredients

6 eggs

- Black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoons dry mustard
- 1 large zucchini
- 400g sweet potato
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups frozen peas
- 1 medium brown onion
- 1 teaspoon dried mixed herbs
- 1 ½ tablespoons parsley
- 1 cup wholemeal SR flour
- 1 cup reduced fat grated cheese
- Olive oil spray

Method

Preheat oven to 200°C.

- 1. Spray large baking dish with olive oil.
- 2. Grate zucchini.
- 3. Peel and slice onion.
- 4. Peel and grate sweet potato.
- 5. Finely chop parsley.
- 6. Whisk the eggs, black pepper and mustard and set aside.
- 7. In a large bowl, combine remaining ingredients.
- 8. Add the egg and mix well.
- 9. Pour into the prepared baking dish.
- 10. Bake 40-50 mins until firm and lightly browned


